Bark Freeman had been chasing loved the boats but
of no use he had been galed at sundown gave his
up

Wednesday Sept 4th fine breezes from S E
cruised between the Islands saw several sails

Thursday Sept 5th Light breezes from N E
at Fayal at 4 Pm went into the port the Capt
Hand Court crew went on shore at dark the boat
came off with letters middle & latter going off S O

Friday Sep 6th fine breezes from N E ship
lying off S on waiting for a boatsteerer who
is on shore with his wife

Saturday Sep the 7th fine weather ship lying
off S on at 8 Am the boat went on shore at
night the boat came off the Capt on shore
man missing latter lying off and on

Sunday Sept 8th

Monday Sep 9th fine weather & strong
breezes from S W lying off S on at Fayal
at 10 Am the Capt & boat went on shore at night
the Capt came off with 2 men that he had ship
one boatsteerer & one foremast hand latter
working to the W

Tuesday Sept 10th strong breezes from
N E steering N W by W middle & latter
under all sail so ends the day

Remarks On Board Wednesday Sept 11th
fine breezes from the southward steering to the
Nath & Westward saw flocks & came at sundown
Spoke the ship Swallow of New Bedford latter
fine weather steering N W by W

Thursday Sept 12th begins with light
Westward steering N W by the wind middle
& latter part squally

Friday Sep 13th first part fine breezes
from S W steering S W middle part strong
squalls from S W latter part more moderate
saw a number of sails

Saturday Sep 14th first part light winds
from the S E at 8 Am spoke the Bark
John Dawson & kept off to the westward
in C^o at 9 Am saw a school of whales at 10 Am
lowerd the boats mated with the Dawson the
boats chased till our waste & S starboard boats
struck took him along side of the Dawson our
waist & starboard boats aboard the D cutting in
the mate & second mate of the D on board the
Sucker boat 41" 23 Long 37" 10 west

Sunday Sep 15th begins with strong breezes
from the westward & some rain Capt Brinnell
on board the Dawson at sundown came on
board steering on Diff tacks so ends the day

Monday Sep 16th begins with strong breezes
from S steering on diff tacks so ends this
days

Tuesday Sept 17th

Wednesday Sep 18th begins with strong winds
from S in C^o with the Dawson at 11 Am raised whales
lowerd the boats at 12 Pm boats struck at 3 Pm came on board
our waite boat on board J D & Cap Cornell on board of us
it blowing a gale split our fore top mast staysail & fore top
sail lost Cap C. boat & our cranes the Dawson to windward
at 5 pm the boats left the whale and went on board "
