

Remarks On Board Monday Oct 7th 1861
this day begins with fine weather and light winds
from the northward steering to N^W heavy swell

Tuesday Oct 8th these 24 hours moderate gales
from the westward with rain ship lying to un-
easy sail

Wednesday Oct 9th strong breezes from the N^W
working to the westward saw one sail steering to the
eastward so ends this day

Thursday Oct 10th first part light winds
from the N^W steering to the southward latter
part strong breezes employed in coopersing provisions
& repairing the main sail

Friday Oct 11th first part of this day begins
with light airs from N^E with fog steering to the
westward latter part squally ship under easy sail

Saturday Oct 12th moderate gales from N^W mid-
dle part being heavy ship hove to under close reefed
main topsails and fore topmast studd

Sunday Oct 13th this day begins with moderate
gales from N^W & some rain ship under easy sail
so ends this day

Monday Oct 14th all these 24 hours light
winds from the N^W steering to the eastward
one sail in sight

Tuesday Oct 15th begins with light breezes
from N^W steering to the eastward under easy
sail latter part steering S^E under all sail

Wednesday Oct 16th fine breezes from the westward
steering S^E under all sail at 1 pm saw sperm whale
lowered with out success latter part ship by the
wind so ends this day

light winds from the N^W at 5 Am kept the ship off
S^E at 1 Pm saw the Isle of Carvo latter part
spoke Bark Lafayette of New Bedford with 130

Friday
Wednesday Oct 18th this day begins with
strong breezes from N^W steering S^E by S for
Fayal in C^o with the Lafayette at 8 Am lowered
the boats raised whales first mattede with the L^o our
larboard boat struck at 10 Am the whale turned up
and took him along side of the Lafayette at 11 Pm
comenced cutting

Saturday Oct 19th begins with strong
breezes from the N^W our mate on board
the Lafayette & with the boats crew helping cutting
in spoke the ship George & Susan of N^o B with
100 150 3P boiling a large whale

Sunday Oct 20th begins with strong breezes
from the West lying under easy sail in C^o with
the Lafayette latter part more moderate

Monday Oct 21th begins with light airs
from all quarters at 1 Pm raised sperm whales
lowered all 6 boats without success the whales going
quick to the N^W Fayal bearing S^E 25 miles
distants the Lafayette in C^o boiling

Tuesday Oct 22nd this day begins with
moderate gails from the N^W ship under easy
sail heading N^W the Lafayette finished boiling
the whale turned up 80 bls latter part more moderate

Wednesday Oct 23th begins with light breezes
from all points under short sail put some cloth
on board the Lafayette latter part fine breezes from
N^W steering for Fayal bluffed too & lay aback
all night under the land
