fine weather & moderate breezes from the Southward
cruising on the wind latter part gamed with
the Ben Tucker & Bark Nye

Monday Mar 3rd fine weather & light winds
from S.E. cruising on the wind 3 sails in sight
latter part the same

Tuesday Mar 4th fine weather & light winds
from S.E. cruising on the wind the Harrell
Thompson of New York from Montevideo bound to
the west Indies latter part gamed with the Ben
Tucker & Bark Nye Lat 31° 8' South
Long 45° 20' West

Wednesday 5th strong breezes from E.S.E.
cruising on the wind the Ben Tucker in
sight to windward latter part gamed with
the Ben Tucker & Arab the Arab looking
a 30 lb whale

Thursday Mar 6th strong breezes from the
E. cruising on the wind latter part the same
with Rain so ends this day

Friday Mar 7th strong breezes from the E
with rain & fog gamed with the Chili latter
part the same cruising on the wind

Saturday Mar 8th fine weather & moderate
breezes from the N.W. cruising on the wind latter
part strong breezes gamed with the Chili

Sunday Mar 9th moderate gales from E.S.E. steering
to Southward through the day under easy sail
in B.E. with the Chili latter part more moderate
with a heavy swell on

Monday Mar 10th strong breezes from S.E.
fine weather latter part light winds at 6 P.M.
raised whales off the weather beam an old Portuguese rig
Brigg run through them & all of them lowered with
success Lat 31° 13' S Long 44° 00' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 11th
Fine weather and light airs from S.W. on different
tacks by the wind latter part moderate breezes
from S.E. working to the S.W.

Wednesday March 12th all these 24 hours light
breezes from N.W. cruising on the wind saw
finbacks one sail in sight

Thursday March 13th first part light breezes
from N.W. latter part strong breezes from E
Pairing N.W. weather thick & hazy

Friday March 14th strong breezes from the E
steering S by W under all sail latter part
more moderate so ends this day

Saturday March 15th strong breezes from the
Eastward with rain standing to the Northward
by the wind saw a french ship standing S.W.
at 7 A.M. raised whales lowered all the boats and
chased them to the windward at 11 A.M. came up
with them starboard boat started at them but did
not get fast whales turned to leeward all three
boats in chase with out success Lat 30° 10' South
Long 44° 20' West

Sunday March 16th fine weather & light winds
from N. still chasing whales at 1 P.M. the starboard
boat struck & got stove & drewered at 2 P.M. got on
board shortly after the larboard boat struck &
drewered still chasing the whales to the leeward
fell in with the Bark Pacific of New Bedford
33 months out with 4000 lbs bound home she lowered
3 boats but with out success at dark gave them up &
came on board whales going quick to the S.E. W.
laying aback all night latter part rather the same
standing to the eastward the Pacific in sight

Monday March 17th fine weather & moderate
breezes from N. cruising on the wind latter part
wind from the westward steering to the S.E. employed
in mending the Starboard Boat
Sounded this day
