first part light breezes from the
N. working to the N.E. latter part
light breezes from S.W. steering

Saturday June 14th this day begins
with light breezes from the S.W. at
1 P.M. saw sperm whales at 2 P.M. lowered
the boats at 4 P.M. the S. Boats struck
at dark took him along side middle
part - calm employed in getting up
the cutting gear at 5 A.M. commenced cutting
at 6.30 A.M. finished cutting & made sail
latter part employed in clearing away the
head, one sail in sight

Lat 33 " 00' East
Long 47 " 35' West

Sunday June 15th begins with light
breezes from S.W. steering on different
tacks by the wind middle part rainy
latter part commenced boiling

Monday June 16th begins with light
winds from S.W. steering N.E. at 2 P.M.
set came to the wind with the main
yard aback at 10 P.M. finished boiling
22⁺ lbs latter part fine breezes from
S.W. steering N.E.

Tuesday June 17th this day begins
with fine weather & light winds from
S.W. steering N.E. middle & latter
fresh winds from S.W. steering N.E.

Wednesday June 18th strong winds
from S.W. steering N.E. at dark
luffed to the wind on the Starboard
tack To land this day

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Remarks On Board Thursday June 19th
begins with light winds from the S
working to the N.E. latter part wind from
N.E. working to the S.E. at 3 A.M. lowered
for a humpback & blackfish the barboard
boat struck the humpback & drewed the
Star Boat struck a blackfish & drewed the W
boat caught a blackfish & got stove

Long 44 " 47' West

breezes from N.E. heading S.E. latter
part light & fine weather

Saturday June 21st this day begins
with breezes from N.E. heading S.E.
latter part light winds from
S.E. with rain

Sunday June 22nd begins with
light breezes from S.E. steering S.E.
latter part wind from S.E. with
rain

Monday June 23rd this day begins
with light winds from S.E.
steering S.E. latter part steering
N.E. wind from S.E. Lat 37 " 14' North
Long 41 " 37' West

Tuesday June 24th this day begins
with light breezes from S.W. steering
N.E. latter part the same To land
this day

Wednesday June 25th strong breezes from
S.W. steering N.E. by 4 P.M. spoke the Bark
Propic B. of New Bedford
& made out 15 lbs sperm

Thursday June 26th strong breezes from
S.W. steering N.E. at 8 A.M. saw a large sperm
whale going quick to the wind and leaved the boat with
at success Lat 40 " 00' S Long 40 " 00' W
