

Remarks On Board Sunday Jan 4th 1863
fine weather & moderate breeze from S.W. & steering
S.W. by W. Caught a turtle. One sail in sight latter
wind from S.W. standing on the wind. Caught
a Porpoise & lost him. Ends day.

Monday Jan 5th fine weather & light winds from
S.W. & steering on the wind to the S.W. by W.
latter part wind S.W. & steering South good
weather so ends this day Lat 35 .. 58 South
Long West

Tuesday Jan 6th Strong winds from N.E. &
weather thick & hazy steering South latter part
wind from the South & steering on the wind to
the S.W. by W. Lat 36 .. 54 South
Long 48 .. 01 West

Wednesday Jan 7th fine weather & light wind
from the S.W. steering to the S.W. by W. latter
part light wind S.W. & steering S.W. by W.
Lat 37 .. 54 South
Long 48 .. 27 West

Thursday Jan 8th Strong breezes from S.W. &
at 3 P.M. raised a squall off the weather beam 3 miles
off caught it at 4 P.M. while worked to windward under
double reefed topsails one sail in sight. A merchant
saw no more of the whale Lat 37 .. 53 South
Long 45 .. 22 West

Friday Jan 9th good weather & moderate breeze
from S.W. steering on the wind to the S.W. by W.
under all sail. One sail in sight. A merchant
saw plenty fin backs latter part wind from
N.E. & steering S.W. by W. Lat 38 .. 33 South
Long 47 .. 37 West

Saturday Jan 10th Strong breezes from N.E. &
steering on the wind under double reefed topsails
latter part good strong breezes steering S.W. by W.
Lat 40 .. 10 S. Long 59 .. 13 West

Sunday Jan 11th good weather & strong wind from
S.W. steering S.W. by W. double reefed topsails at 5 P.M.
had a heavy squall from N.E. & W. with thunder &
lightning & rain middle part moderate gale from
S.W. & steering S.W. by W. Lat 40 .. 55 South
Long 52 .. 24 West

Remarks On Board Monday Jan 12th 1863
this day begins with good weather & moderate wind
from S.W. steering S.W. by W. under all sail latter part
strong breezes from S.W. & steering S.W. by W. &
under double reefed topsails Lat 43 .. 30 South
Long 53 .. 00 West

Tuesday Jan 13th moderate gales from the N.E. &
heading to the S.W. under double reefed topsails
middle part blowing heavy with a lead swell on
latter more moderate wind from the S.W. heading
to the S.W. so ends this day Lat 44 .. 50 South
Long 54 .. 50 West

Wednesday Jan 14th good weather & light winds
from the S.W. steering on the wind to the S.W. by W.
latter part moderate breezes S.W. by W. with rain
steering S.W. so ends this day

Thursday Jan 15th Strong gales from N.E. & W.
to S.W. by W. under closed reefed main topsails
& fore topsails staysails at 9 P.M. shipped a sea
stove out the gang way board & the bulwarks on the
starboard side middle & latter the same with a bulwark
leg running shipped a sea & stove the waist. Lost the
forward Davit & Crain & stove the bulwarks & lost
other things too numerous to mention to mention
Lat 45 .. 25 South
Long 55 .. 05 West

Friday Jan 16th Strong breezes from S.W. &
Squally at 3 P.M. spoke the Bark America of
Nantucket 4 miles out. At 10 P.M. the Friday previous
they struck a N.E. by E. whale which stove 2 boats for
them & lost him latter part moderate breezes
steering to the S.W.

Saturday Jan 17th begins with moderate
winds from S.W. with good weather. Cruising
on the wind the Bark America in sight
menaced the whist boat latter part the same

Sunday Jan 18th fine weather & light winds
from the S.W. at 3 P.M. squared with the America
latter part wind from S.W. steering S.W. by W.
at 12 P.M. luffed to the wind in Co. with the America.
Lat 46 .. 16 South
Long 57 .. 03 West
