

Remarks On Board Nov 1st Sunday 1863
Strong winds from N.E. Star Watch
Liberty at 4 PM the Schooner Sarah & Lewis
of Boston was found to be on fire in the after
hold got a force pump from shore & put the fire
out burned up all the cutting gear, spare sails

Monday Nov 2nd fine winds from E.S.E.
employed in getting ready for sea discharged
Mr. Fisher the 2nd mate & Reatter Antons
a few mast hands for sickness

Tuesday Nov 3rd strong winds from S.S.E.
at anchor middle moderate gales at 9
PM let go the third anchor & sent down the
topgallant yards a heavy swell on

Wednesday Nov 4th moderate gales from
S.S.E. lying with three anchors ahead
latter more moderate

Thursday Nov 5th fresh winds from S.S.E.
took up the starboard anchor & got off
some recruits so ends

Friday Nov 6th lying at anchor ready
for sea waiting for a second officer

Saturday Nov 7th fine weather wind from
S.S.E. at 8 AM commenced heaving a head
Francis Silvia Perry 2nd mate came on board
employed in getting the anchors

Sunday Nov 8th fresh breeze from S.S.W. at
2 PM slipped from the mooring anchor, & stood
out of the harbor the Capt. on shore ship lying
off on at 6 PM the boat went ashore for the
Capt. at 8 PM the Capt. came on board at 7
the Capt. went in & got two men off the rocks
middle steering & at noon St George I was
4 miles,

Remarks On Board Monday Nov 9th 1863
first part of the breeze from S.S.E. heading
to the E on diff. tack latter light winds from E.S.E.
at 7 AM saw 5 PM whale's close to St George at 8
lowered the boats at noon the Star Boat went along
side of a whale struck the iron came out all in
chase the whales going down for St George head St
George head Baring off dis 12 miles so ends

Tuesday Nov 10th light winds from E.S.E.
boats in chase of the whales at 1 PM the Star Boat
struck at 4 PM got him along side got up
the cutting gear middle wind E.S.E. heading
N.E. at 5 PM commenced cutting at moon
got the head off the N.E. point of Hayal
I dis 15 miles

Wednesday Nov 11th fresh breeze from E.S.E.
at 2.30 PM finished the body at 4 PM got
the junk in at 7 finished larding the case
latter steering for Hayal harbor employed
in boiling

Thursday Nov 12th at noon the Capt.
went on shore the ship lying off & on boiling
at 3 PM 6 casks came on board from shore
light airs & variables at 4 PM let go the
anchor with a cutting eye sent to it to
keep the ship from going ashore got up the
starboard chain bent it & let go 3 anchors &
latter came off took up 1 anchor & brought
it to the ship sent the chain to it & let it
go latter strong winds from I took up the 1
anchor & took the chase of a mooring anchor
in the I horse pit so ends this day boiling

Friday Nov 13 strong winds from I
employed in boiling 10 tons of stores came
on board for salist at 4 PM finished boiling
the whale turned up 80 lbs

Saturday Nov 14th fine breeze from S.S.E.
at anchor employed in Coopering & filling
the oil the Schooner Sarah & Lewis sailed
to day
