Friday Feb 26<sup>th</sup> strong winds from E.S.E  
on different tacks George in sight

Long 44.52 West

Saturday Feb 27<sup>th</sup> fresh breeze from E.S.E to E  
heading N.W.E gained with the George  
Lat 30.10 South  
Long 44.47 West

Sunday Feb 28<sup>th</sup> strong breeze from E on  
diff tacks boarded the English schooner  
"Sea Bird" 56 days from Placourt bound to  
Rio Grand so ends No obs

Monday Feb 29<sup>th</sup> Moderate gales from  
E.S.E heading S.E under short sail  
the George in sight  
Lat 30.40 South  
Long 44.00 West

Fresh gales from E.S.E to N.E heading to the  
S.E under short sail No obs

Wednesday March 2<sup>nd</sup> Moderate gales from  
N.W.E heading to the E under short sail  
Lat 31.30 South  
Long 44.04 West

Thursday March 3<sup>rd</sup> Moderate breeze from  
S.W.E on different tacks weather thick and  
raining so ends this day No obs

Friday March 4<sup>th</sup> light variable air and  
calms boarded a French brig No obs

Saturday March 5<sup>th</sup> light variable air  
working to the N Lat 31.35 South  
Long 44.08 West

Sunday March 6<sup>th</sup> all these 24 hours variable  
air from N.W.E to N.W on diff tacks  
Lat 31.12 South  
Long 44.44 West

Monday March 7<sup>th</sup> Commenced with fresh breeze  
from N.W.E spoke the gosh Bragdon Middle  
& latter heading to the N.W spoke the  
Bragdon and got a keg of paint of her  
Lat 30.45 South  
Long 45.35 West

Tuesday March 8<sup>th</sup> strong variable winds  
working to the N.E Lat 30.05  
Long 44.49 West

Wednesday March 9<sup>th</sup> being with fresh breeze  
from S.E steering E.S.E sent up the studding  
sails to work & beat the royal & sent them  
aloft Lat 29.45 South  
Long 42.45 West
