Dec 25th

Friday. First of these 24 hours heavy rain mid latter parts the same hands employed in various jobs boat dishes & so ends

Dec 26th

Saturday. First of these 24 hours frequent showers of rain mid latter parts fine weather so ends this day

Dec 30th

Sunday. First of these 24 hours fine weather light variable wind not much going on boat dishes mid latter parts the same so ends this day

Dec 31st

Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather mid part the same latter part much rain so ends this day

Jan 1st

Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather mid parts strong & variable wind with much rain part of the crew went on shore to day so ends

Jan 2nd

Wednesday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather mid & latter part fine weather so ends this day

Jan 3rd

Thursday. First of these 24 hours fine weather brought one of our men on board that had deserted and was caught by the Police his name is William Sosa mid & latter parts passing showers the doctor & Mr. Del Miller refused to come on board ship brought him on board by force Mr. Miller took a kick on the back of the head & one of the ground tier lash with two worn shoes in it till the rest appeared good so ends this day

Jan 4th

Friday. First of these 24 hours frequent showers of rain employed stowing down finished at 5 hours. PM mid & latter parts the same got up a small raft of water today so ends this day

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Jan 5th

Saturday. First of these 24 hours heavy squalls of rain & rain mid & latter parts much the same William Sosa deserted again last night at 7 hours. And got under weigh and came to Anchor about of 5.4. hours so ends this day

Jan 6th

Sunday. First of these 24 hours rainy weather & heavy squalls caught two of our men that had deserted. Nathan Snipp & Herbert D. Swift brought the men on board & put them in Irons mid & latter parts much squalls & rain & rain so ends this day

Jan 7th

Monday. First of these 24 hours heavy squalls and plenty of rain mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Jan 8th

Tuesday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather passing showers mid & latter parts the same one of our men deserted today who had been on duty his name is Woodliff & Johann. Native so ends

Jan 9th

Wednesday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & moderate breeze with passing showers mid & latter parts the same we caught our man that deserted & brought him on board so ends this day

Jan 10th

Thursday. First of these 24 hours fresh breeze from NW with passing showers at half past 3. PM took our Anchor and stood out to sea steering SE at dark. Wake bore NW 20 miles distant mid & latter parts strong breeze so ends this day Lat 4.28 Long 56.55
