Sunday
July 18th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & moderate breeze from N.W. R.H. steering N.E. by N. saw 2 sail at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Monday
July 19th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.W. wind R.H. steering N.W. mid & latter parts the same so ends this day Lat 36.36 Long 49.18

Tuesday
July 20th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.W. wind R.H. steering W. by W mid & latter parts the same Joseph & herman off duty sick so ends this day Lat 36.10 Long 50.30

Wednesday
July 21st. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N.E. winds R.H. steering W. by W saw Porpoises mid & latter parts the same at 8 P.M. raised 4 sperm whales lower at for them & the R.H. went on & struck killed him so ends this day no Obs

Thursday
July 22nd. First of these 24 hours fine weather & East by winds Boats still in chase of who has got our whale long side at 2 P.M. at 3 P.M. the S.H. went long side of one but the whale saw the Boat darted at him but the S.H. drew away after taking a little line chased them & spell then came on board & began cutting at 5 P.M. worked off mid & latter parts fine weather cut the whales head off & body in at 12.16 so ends

July 24th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & calm hands employed boiling & cutting fuel mid part the same latter part light wind from N.W. so ends this day no Obs

Sunday
July 25th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N.W. wind finished boiling at 3 P.M. mid & latter parts light & variable winds Joseph & herman off duty sick so ends this day Lat 35.14 Long 51.16

Monday
July 26th. First of these 24 hours fine weather light variable winds & calm saw 3 porpoises Porpoises & our sail mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends

Tuesday
July 27th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable winds R.H. steering N.E. hands employed stowing down & washing at ship mid & latter parts the same so ends
Lat 35.08 Long 51.30

Wednesday
July 28th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N.W. wind R.H. steering different courses saw 3 porpoises & 3 porpoises mid & latter parts the same so ends Lat 35.39 Long 51.14

Thursday
July 29th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light wind from N.W. R.H. steering N.E. by N. boarded the American ship the Seneca two days from N York bound to Cuba mid & latter parts light variable winds saw no other sail so ends
