

Remarks On board B W

Wednesday

Aug 25th First of these 24 hours fine weather & moderate breeze from W. NW side & sail to day also sent out coal of Grompussea mid & latter parts the same at 11 hours. And raised fire during day so ends this day Lat 38.34 Long 28.01

Thursday

Aug 26th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong breeze from the Westward B W steering E by S heading in for Fayall at 6 hours. And kept to the wind at dark. Fayall bore E by S 10 miles distant also saw one sail mid & latter part heavy weather at dawn. And kept off for Fayall & dropped anchor at 8 hours. And in 18 fathoms water Capt went on shore & sent off letters so ends this day

Friday

Aug 27th First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly wind hands employed breaking out mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Saturday

Aug 28th First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly wind hands employed in Coopering out mid part the same latter part raring finished Coopering out so ends this day

Sunday

Aug 29th First of these 24 hours heavy weather sent out oil on shore to day mid part fine latter part blowing heavy from N E with heavy rain. At dark went on shore to day so ends

Monday

Aug 30th Blowing hard from N E with heavy rain mid part more moderate latter part fine weather the fourth. Mate. Mr James & two of the crew deserted there names are Joseph. Mootoket & Manuel Joking. Mr King came off at 9. & so ends this day

Aug 31st

Monday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds hands employed stowing ground tier & sitting up shooks mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day

Wednesday

Sept 1st First of these 24 hours fine weather light variable winds & calm hands employed breaking out & stowing down mid & latter part the same at 9 hours. P.M. Andrew Cooper and the Cook & one man forward attempted to desert but was caught & put in irons so ends this day

Thursday

Sept 2nd First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable winds hands employed in various jobs don't decks finished sitting up shooks to day mid & latter parts weather the same last night Charles Smith William MacCarthy Cook & a Negro Patigues deserted but we caught 2 of them so ends this day

Friday

Sept 3rd First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Southward by wind hands employed in various jobs don't decks discharged. Mr King the second Mate to day mid part the same latter parts raring so ends

Saturday

Sept 4th First of these 24 hours strong breeze from the Northward at 2 hours. P.M. look out. Anchor and went to sea mid & latter parts clearing fresh so ends shipped 4 men Lat 38.28 Long 30 Decora

Sept 5th First of these 24 hours fine weather gamed with B W Gannet Webster Capt Borden 40 months out 1.100 mid & latter parts fine weather so ends this day Lat 38.32
