Thursday

March 31st First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable wind not much going on board decks mid & latter parts weather the same sent on shore boats crew on liberty to day so ends this day

Friday

April 1st First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind hands employed getting off. Potatoes at earnest sent a Boat in for liberty. Men & they all came off but David Snee he was taken in charge & put in prison & this morning he was tried & sentenced for three months let the other half of the watch go on shore so ends this day

Saturday

April 2nd First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable wind hands employed in various jobs about decks the hands all came off at dark mid & latter parts the same let another Boat crew go on liberty to day so ends

Sunday

April 3rd First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & strong breeze from N.W. the watch all came off at night mid & latter parts clearing away with rain so ends this day

Monday

April 4th First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Tuesday

April 5th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.W. wind hands employed in various jobs about decks mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Wednesday

April 6th First of these 24 hours fine weather & South by East wind hands employed setting up rigging mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

April 7th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind hands employed setting up rigging mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Friday

April 8th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind weighed anchor to day (and went further out mid part rainy) latter part fine weather so ends this day

Saturday

April 9th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind hands employed in various jobs about decks mid & latter parts the same as before & Cooper & Boat crew & one man forward

Sunday

April 10th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day the Carpenter of Garrison

Monday

April 11th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind mid & latter parts the same at 1 o'clock the Boat crew on board took over. Anchor & went to sea so ends & Mr

Brooding Loggers who had shipped 2nd. Wrote came on board with the Capt

Tuesday

April 12th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.W. wind hands employed in various jobs about decks mid & latter parts weather much the same wind from N.E. so ends Sat. 34.25

Wednesday

April 13th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong breeze from N.E. R.K. steering by the wind heading to the Northward mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day Lat 3.306 Long 175.22

Thursday

April 14th First of these 24 hours fine weather & N.E. wind R.K. steering by the wind heading N. mid & latter parts weather much the same hands employed in various jobs about decks & in the rigging so ends Lat 3.2.15 Long 175.17 John & Gordon came on duty to day
