Friday
April 15th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a rather by
winds hands employed in various jobs boat
deck's mid & latter parts strong breeze so ends this day
Lat 30.57 Long 175.32

Saturday
April 16th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a fresh breeze
from the Eastward. Bk steering by the wind
heading. N. N. E. mid & latter parts the same
so ends this day Lat 30.19 Long 175.39

Sunday
April 17th. First of these 24 hours frequent squalls of wind
& rain wind from the Eastward mid & latter
parts fine weather so ends this day.
Lat 32.41 Long 175.44

Monday
April 18th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a moderate
breeze from the Eastward. Bk steering by the wind
on port to all mid & latter parts light air one of
the foretopmast shrouds parted to day repaired it.
so ends this day Lat 32.31 Long 175.50

Tuesday
April 19th. First of these 24 hours fine weather and a
light breeze from the N. E. Bk steering by the wind
mid & latter parts cloudy with some rain so ends this day

Wednesday
April 20th. First of these 24 hours variable winds & rain
Bk steering E. N. E. mid & latter parts much the same
so ends this day Lat 32.56 Long 177.28

Thursday
April 21st. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a wind
Bk steering E. N. E. mid & latter parts blowing
hard from the Southward so ends this day
Lat 32.56 Long 178.51

Friday
April 22nd. First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the N. E.
Bk under lower topsails & staysails steering by the
wind mid & latter parts weather the same
so ends this day Lat 31.48 Long 178.59

Saturday
April 23rd. First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from the
Southward. Bk steering different courses at 5 P.M.
pulled fore topsails & luffed to the wind mid & latter
parts equally so ends this day Lat 31.13 Long 178.18 W

Sunday
April 24th. First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from the
Southward. Bk steering by the wind under 2 close
reared topsails & staysails mid & latter parts more
moderate put up bunt in fore to day and put him
in the Bunkroom so ends Lat 30.08 Long 178.13

Monday
April 25th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a strong breeze
from the Southward. Bk steering by the wind on different
tacks at dark shortened sail took up bunt out of fore
mid & latter parts eight winds raised. French Bunk
at daylight also saw 3 Finbacks so ends this day
Lat 30.22 Long 178.47

Tuesday
April 26th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light
easterly wind saw the land & Finbacks at dark
tacked ship & shortened sail land bearing E 12
miles distant mid & latter parts weather the same
so pulled bobstay parted to day at 8 hours. And raised
a school of small whales on our weather beam
lowered for them at 10. And at 12 M the
W. B. went on & struck and parted short warp
& the whales went to windward made all sail
in chase of them so ends this day
no obs
