Jan 12th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind
 Saturday B. H. steering different courses mid & latter parts the same saw
 B. H. sailing to the Eastward so ends at 36 31

Jan 13th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & S. E. wind at 25
 Sunday raised sperm whales lowered 3. Boats for them the 2nd
 Mate struck & the other boats struck soon after but the
 B. H. got stove had to cut got the other 2 to the ship
 at 10 P.M. with latter parts fine weather nooked
 on to our whales at 5. And finished cutting at 10. S. ends

Jan 14th. Lat 36.08 Long 162 23 E
 Monday First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong breeze
 from S. E. hands employed cutting junk mid & latter
 parts the same started to cut at 8 P.M. so ends Lat 35.59 Long 162.31

Jan 15th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong N. W. wind
 Tuesday hands employed boiling mid & latter parts blew up a gale
 and down at 6 P.M. so ends this day Lat 35.45 Long 163.34

Jan 16th. First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from N. W. at 4 P.M.
 Wednesday wind shifted to S. W. and moderated started the work again
 mid part fine weather latter part squally so ends this day

Jan 17th. Lat 35.24 Long 163.34
 Thursday First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from S. W. with
 sea running saw one sail to the Eastward mid & latter part
 weather much the same so ends this day Lat 34.40

Jan 18th. First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from S. W. with frequent
 Friday squalls of rain mid & latter parts squally so ends this day

Jan 19th. Lat 34.06 Long 162.33
 Saturday First of these 24 hours variable wind & squally weather
 B. H. steering by the wind on Port tack mid & latter parts squally
 employed stowing down so ends this day Lat 34.02 Long 162.33

Jan 20th. First of these 24 hours southerly by wind & squally finished stowing
 Sunday down at 2 P.M. saw Black fish to day mid & latter parts weather
 much the same. Robt. took off duty sick so ends Lat 34.02 Long 161.15

Jan 21st. First of these 24 hours strong southerly by wind B. H. steering
 Monday by the wind heading to westward mid & latter parts fine weather
 saw 4. Frampuses to day so ends this day
 Lat 33.56 Long 161.16
