

Remarks On board B.K.R. Morrison

- March 6th First of these 24 hours strong S.W. wind. B.K. & Tuesday steering W by N. & W. NW at dusk shortened sail mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends boat 33.31 Long 156.42
- March 7th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong S.E. wind. B.K. Friday steering W mid & latter parts weather the same saw 2 steamers steering to the Eastward so ends this day boat 33.51 Long 157.52
- March 8th First of these 24 hours light S.W. wind. B.K. Saturday mid & latter parts variable wind so ends boat 33.12 Long 152.25
- March 9th First of these 24 hours strong N.W. wind. B.K. Sunday W. N.W. saw 3 sail all steering to the Eastward at 10. P.M. raised by day light at 6. P.M. took 2. Tug boat and towed to the anchorage dropped anchor at half past 7 in 10 fathoms water so ends
- March 10th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind. Monday mid part weather the same Capt went on shore this morning hands employed was hired ship so ends this day
- March 11th First of these 24 hours fine weather & S.W. wind. Tuesday employed in various jobs mid & latter parts strong S.W. wind with rain cleared away at 6. P.M. hands employed breaking out kumback oil barrel so ends this day
- March 12th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong S.W. wind. Wednesday employed breaking out mid & latter parts rain so ends this day
- March 13th First of these 24 hours light variable wind with rain. Thursday much doing about deck's mid & latter parts fine weather employed steering down a miffy back for salt water so ends this day
- March 14th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind. Friday employed filling back with water mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day
- March 15th First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly wind hands employed in various jobs about deck's mid & latter parts weather the same employed painting ship so ends this day
- March 16th First of these 24 hours fine weather & S.E. wind mid & latter Sunday parts strong breeze so ends this day
- March 17th First of these 24 hours blowing gale from the Southward. Monday mid & latter parts weather much the same over kumback oil was taken on shore to day. Robert Pomer came on duty today
- March 18th First of these 24 hours blowing hard from Southward with rain employed Tuesday breaking out mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

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- March 19th First of these 24 hours westerly wind & cloudy hands employed Wednesday steering back for water mid part passing skims latter part fine weather took 20 tons water to day from Dwyer boat so ends this day
- March 20th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly Thursday wind employed steering back for fresh water mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day
- March 21st First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind. Friday took on board 2 two Tons. Bread today mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day
- March 22nd First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly. Saturday wind took on board 2 1/2 Tons. Flour mid & latter parts weather the same Capt came on board to day but soon went on shore again. Mr. Lomas & Mr. Gomez also went took on board 48 tons more water so ends this day
- March 23rd First of these 24 hours fine weather & light westerly Sunday mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day
- March 24th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S.E. wind. Monday mid & latter parts the same. Mr. Gomez came on board to day employed setting up rigging so ends this day
- March 25th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly. Tuesday wind hands busy employed mid & latter parts weather the same let 2 of the foremast chanks & one of the by go on shore to day the rest busy employed so ends
- March 26th First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind. Wednesday painting mid & latter parts the same so ends this day
- March 27th First of these 24 hours fine weather & calm fitted a new pump to day mid & latter parts weather the same. Thursday 2 of our men departed there names are Andrew Cooper & Robert Cooper
- March 28th First of these 24 hours fine weather & calm employed in various ways. Friday Mr. Gomez & Cooper went on shore to day mid & latter parts thick weather Capt came on board to day for a few minutes & let several go on shore so ends this day
- March 29th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong S.E. wind. Saturday mid & latter parts the same. Mr. Gomez came on board today
- March 30th First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong S.E. wind. Sunday mid & latter parts weather the same our men that went on duty Friday all came off to day so ends this day
