

Remarks on board B. K. R. Morrison. A.D. 1884

- March 31st
 Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather light variable winds mid & latter parts cloudy let four men go on shore to day. Sunday from Capt. Mosher so ends this day.
- April 1st
 Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind employed in various jobs 2nd. Woots went on shore to day mid & latter parts calm so ends this day.
- April 2nd
 Wednesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & calm employed in the rigging mid & latter parts weather the same Harry Bartlett deserted from the ship to day while on duty the liberty men all came off to day let 3 more go on shore so ends this day.
- April 3rd
 Thursday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day.
- April 4th
 Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & N. E. wind mid & latter parts raining our men all came off to day let 3 more go on liberty so ends this day.
- April 5th
 Saturday. First of these 24 hours raining weather our men & small stores came to day slowed them away mid & latter parts weather much the same Jack Macky free off duty sick so ends this day.
- April 6th
 Sunday. First of these 24 hours variable wind & raining weather mid & latter parts weather the same our men all came off but 2 Harry Bartlett & George Cooper so ends.
- April 7th
 Monday. First of these 24 hours strong variable wind & rain weather mid & latter parts the same dropped 2nd.
- April 8th
 Tuesday. Anchor at 11 P.M. so ends this day.
- April 9th
 Wednesday. First of these 24 hours strong Southwardly wind with rain mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day.

Remarks on board B. K. R. Morrison. A.D. 1884

- April 9th
 Wednesday. First of these 24 hours Southwardly wind with frequent rain squalls mid & latter parts weather much the same.
- April 10th
 Thursday. First of these 24 hours variable wind & raining weather mid & latter parts fine weather so ends this day.
- April 11th
 Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind hands employed in various jobs boat decks mid & latter parts fine weather so ends this day.
- April 12th
 Saturday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day.
- April 13th
 Sunday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind mid & latter parts frequent rain squalls so ends this day.
- April 14th
 Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N. E. wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day.
- April 15th
 Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & N. E. wind Capt. Mosher came on board with compass reef & stopped all the afternoon mid & latter parts fine weather John Gardner & John W. Cleaveland went on shore yesterday & deserted.
- April 16th
 Wednesday. First of these 24 hours variable wind with much rain mid & latter parts the same ship 2 men & they came on board to day one as Cook the other as remain there names are. Manuel Brown & Manuel Albert. A list of 20 yellow fever patients was taken on shore to day that of Cook so ends this day. Has been sold.
- April 17th
 Thursday. First of these 24 hours hazy weather & westerly wind with passing showers mid & latter parts fine weather so ends.
- April 18th
 Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & N. E. wind mid & latter parts variable wind & passing showers so ends.
- April 19th
 Saturday. First of these 24 hours N. E. wind & raining weather our potatoes came on board to day 32. Rags mid & latter parts raining so ends this day.
- April 20th
 Sunday. First of these 24 hours raining weather 6 men came on board to day that had shipped their names are William Ward Ship keeper John Neep James Kindred Thomas S. Casey Joseph Riley & Edward Lippert & woman.
