

# Remarks on board R. H. R. Morrison 1884

- April 21<sup>st</sup> Monday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & southerly from mid & latter part fine weather so ends this day
- April 22<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable wind sold 36 gallons of sperm oil to day & more men came off to day. Willson Wilson as Steward. Bernard Stetson as cabin boy. Henry Woods & Jack Corley as second mid & latter parts fine weather. Capt came on board at 10. And then went on shore again to clear ship.
- April 23<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind. At 3 P.M. took a tug & was towed to mid & latter parts fine weather & light & variable wind. Bark steering different courses. Land in sight at day so ends this day. Lat 33.48 Long 152.44
- April 24<sup>th</sup> Thursday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light & variable wind. Bark steering different courses. Land in sight at dark bearing W. mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day. Lat 33.46 Long 154.12
- April 25<sup>th</sup> Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light W. wind. Bark steering by the wind heading to the Eastward mid & latter parts rain & one sail in sight so ends this day.
- April 26<sup>th</sup> Saturday. First of these 24 hours rainy weather & variable wind. Bark steering by the wind on. Port tack so ends this day.
- April 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & Northwesterly wind. Bark steering by the wind on. Port tack mid & latter parts rainy. Bark steering. No ends this day no sails.
- April 28<sup>th</sup> Monday. First of these 24 hours thick rainy weather & southerly wind. Bark steering. No ends this day.
- April 29<sup>th</sup> Tuesday. First of these 24 hours light & variable winds with plenty of rain mid & latter parts equally so ends this day. Lat 31.25 Long 158.08
- April 30<sup>th</sup> Wednesday. First of these 24 hours variable wind & equally weather. mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day. Lat 31.37 Long 154.30

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- May 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday. First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the Eastward. Bark laying to on. Port tack mid & latter parts weather the same now a school of Blackfish to day so ends this day. Lat 31.15 Long 157.47
- May 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday. First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the Eastward. Bark laying to on. Port tack mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day. Lat 30.43 Long 157.45
- May 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday. First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from the Eastward. Bark under lower topsail heading to the Southward mid & latter parts more moderate made more sail so ends this day. Lat 30.49 Long 157.45
- May 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday. First of these 24 hours strong Easterly wind with squalls. Bark steering by the wind heading to the Southward mid & latter parts fine weather so ends this day. Lat 31.23 Long 158.04
- May 5<sup>th</sup> Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light W. wind. Bark steering E. N. E. & by the wind mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends. Shows Island in sight all day so ends. Lat 31.54 Long 159.16
- May 6<sup>th</sup> Tuesday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & strong breeze from the Southward. Bark steering E. S. E. & by the wind at dark Shows Island bare. N by W 2.5 miles distant mid & latter parts strong variable winds so ends this day. Lat 31.40 Long 162.06
- May 7<sup>th</sup> Wednesday. First of these 24 hours strong variable winds with frequent squalls. Bark steering by the wind on different tacks mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends. Lat 31.28 Long 162.32
- May 8<sup>th</sup> Thursday. First of these 24 hours strong Easterly winds. Bark steering by the wind on Starboard tack mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day. Lat 30.11 Long 163.01
