

Remarks on board R. H. R. Morrison

- May 9th Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind. R. H. steering by the wind on different tacks mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day
Lat 30.31 Long 160.32
- May 10th Saturday. First of these 24 hours Easterly wind & equally weather. R. H. steering by the wind on Port tack mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day
Lat 31.23 Long 163.08
- May 11th Sunday. First of these 24 hours strong Easterly wind. R. H. steering by the wind on Port tack mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day
Lat 32.25 Long 163.57 E
- May 12th Monday. First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from N.E. R. H. steering by the wind on Port tack mid & latter parts blowing a gale from N.W. furlled the foresail & fore top sail at 11. A.M. so ends this day no Ob.
- May 13th Tuesday. First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from N.W. R. H. laying to on Port tack mid part the same latter parts more moderate made more sail on the ship so ends Lat 33.19
- May 14th Wednesday. First of these 24 hours thick cloudy & N.W. wind with passing showers. R. H. steering N.E. by E mid part blowing a heavy gale ground winged the main top sail at 4. A.M. latter parts more moderate so ends this day Lat 33.27 Long 165.31
- May 15th Thursday. First of these 24 hours thick cloudy weather & westerly wind. R. H. steering N.E. mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day
Lat 33.14 Long 166.56

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- May 16th Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & big swell. R. H. steering N. by E under all sail mid & latter parts squally so ends this day Lat 31.27 Long 167.29
- May 17th Saturday. First of these 24 hours strong N.W. winds with passing squalls. R. H. steering N. by W mid & latter parts thick haze & weather so ends this day
Lat 29.45 Long 167.56 E
- May 18th Sunday. First of these 24 hours light & E wind with a big swell running. R. H. steering N. by W mid & latter parts light variable winds & calms so ends this day Lat 29.12 Long 166.36
- May 19th Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N.E. wind. R. H. steering by the wind on Port tack mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day Lat 28.30 Long 167.26 E
- May 20th Tuesday. First of these 24 hours thick weather & passing squalls with variable winds raised Phillip Island at half past 2. P.M. bearing N. N.E. R. H. steering by the wind heading N.E. mid & latter parts heavy squalls of wind & rain at 10 hours. A.M. Capt went on shore to stop a month so ends this day Lat 28.15 Long 168.10 E
- May 21st Wednesday. First of these 24 hours strong N.W. wind. R. H. heading off shore at night. Norfolk bore N.W. 20 miles distant mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day Lat 28.25 Long 168.42
- May 22nd Thursday. First of these 24 hours N.W. wind and a heavy swell. R. H. at anchor to day. Win backs to day. Norfolk in sight all day mid & latter parts cloudy with passing showers at 10. A.M. wind shifted to N.E. & were ship so ends this day Lat 28.57 Long 168.54
