Feb 20th

Friday This day began with thick foggy weather at 1. Pm tooked ship heading to the Eastward hands busily employed one man off duty sick & Carpenter who is working the passage up & down and got hurt mid & latter parts raining at 9. Am got a breeze from NW ship steering SE with all sail set so ends
Lat 38 53 Long 125 39

Feb 21st First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & fine breeze from NW
Saturday ship steering SE with all sail set hands busily employed mid & latter part fine weather saw quite a number of vessels to day so ends this day Lat 37 46 Long 124 21

Feb 22nd First of these 24 hours fine weather & fresh breeze from NW ship steering SE & E saw a number of vessels to day spoke schooner became bound to
Loss bay also saw a schooner whaling she had 3. Boats down saw several who he to windward of her so ends this day Lat 37 46 Long 122 72

Feb 23rd First of these 24 hours strong NW wind ship running long the
Monday land shortened sail & made it again at 4. Am at 8. Am put anchors on the bow so ends this day Lat 33 50 Long 119 45

Feb 24th First of these 24 hours fine weather & lite winds from
Tuesday NW ship steering SE & N heading long with the second hands busily employed mid & latter parts calm so ends this day Lat 33 51

Feb 25th First of these 24 hours fine weather & calm saw the same
Wednesday also saw a steamer hands busily employed mid & latter parts lite variable winds ship working up towards the anchorage so ends this day

Feb 26th First of these 24 hours fine weather & lite westerly wind
Thursday ship working up to her. Anchorage got in & came to anchor in 7 fathoms water at 1. Pm
Capt went on shore & returned at 7. Pm mid & latter parts fine weather so ends this day

Feb 27th

Friday This day began with fine weather & strong S.W. wind
Hands busily employed sent deck sent to shore at 3. Pm for Capt came off at 1. latter part foggy so ends this day

Feb 28th First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly winds hands busily
Saturday employed 5 of our. Men went on shore to day to see the Magistrate there names are Chas. Marton. George Clayson. Peter Searkins & Enrique. Brod & George Goodman mid & latter parts weather much the same at 8. Am men all came on board in & shore. Put

at 6. Am turned to Peter Searkins & Little was for liquor & goods
Feb 29th First of these 24 hours blowing fresh from E & E at 2
Sunday shifted to westward hands busily employed mid & latter parts fine weather. Men refused duty to day all them
At 5. Pm still refused sent them forward again so ends

March 1st First of these 24 hours fine weather & lite variable winds
Monday I was discharged from ship William Campbell to day
