 were ship had some squalls of rain shortened sail

 W S W heading NW at 4 PM saw a
 sail weather how at sunset spoke ship
 John & Edward of New Bedford in the (then)
 were ship heading South at 12 noon ship
 latter steered by NW wind W. S. by S so ends
 in obs.,

Sunday 8th comes in cloudy steering NW towards 3 PM
 at 2 PM saw a breck ahead, sunset shortened sail
 were ship heading NW 12 were more steered NW by W
 saw finbacks a piece of a vessel deck been off at long
