 P.M. November, 1st 1857
 comes in wind ESE pleasant some swell
 (at 4 P.M. passed a herm. Brig steering N^W) course
 NW by W, up to 4 P.M. remainder, wind light from E
 steering SW by W

Lat 15° 00' S
 Long 33° 36' W

Sunday 2nd

comes in light winds from East course SW
 by W pleasant remainder light airs from E
 saw a merchant bark steering SW

Lat 16° 22'
 Long 34° 51'

Monday 3rd P.M.

light airs pleasant two sail in sight
 course SW by W middle part course SW latter
 WSW saw several sail some guppies

Lat 17° 27'
 Long 36° 11'

Tuesday 4th light breeze from NE steering SW
 at 4 P.M. SW latter SW saw two sail one finback
 spunked overhead boats

Lat 18° 50' Long 37° 17'

Bound to River La Platte Spinn Whaling
 Wednesday 5th P.M.

comes in moderate breeze from NE steering SW pleasant
 at 4 P.M. being a short Dis E. of Soundings 10 or 20 miles rem. fresh breezes
 from E having N^W to NE saw three sail passed near a Brig steering
 for Rio --- repaired the foresail so ends

Lat 20° 41' S
 Long 37° 23' W

Thursday 6th

comes in pleasant, - wind from NW fresh breeze
 steering SWW saw a large school of Humpbacks 20 m
 fresh breezes thick weather steering SW by S wind
 NE so ends

Lat 23° 04'
 Long 38° 25'

Friday 7th

comes in squally from NW moderate breeze rain
 middle and latter cloudy some light rain saw humpback two
 sail steering NE, wind from NW by S

Lat 26° 20'
 Long 39° 38'

Saturday 8th comes in fresh breeze from SW
 heading NE at 2 P.M. by NE were ship to W rem pleasant
 light air from S considerable swell from W so ends

Lat 26° 40'
 Long 38° 57'
