SUNDAY 28th comes in calm with light airs from E, wind
 heading NW middle wind 8/9 noon left off NW saw gramp-
 porpoises some foggy so ends M. Lat 32.15. Long 49.15 at 4 PM

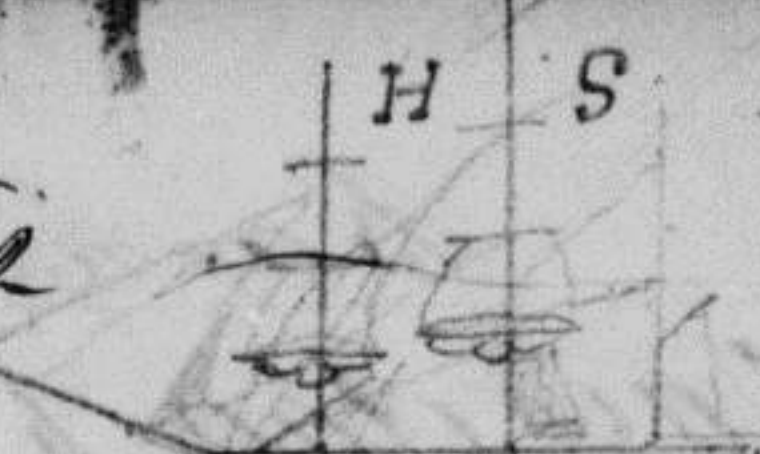
MONDAY 29th comes in moderate wind from SSE first part Bth ing 7 PM
 at 3 PM got them aboard head forward heading N by N by compass
 middle fair latter heading SE by S monkey Lat 32.20 Long 49.35

TUESDAY 30th comes in fair light winds from SE
 steering NW up to 4 PM left too heading NW at sunset
 shortened sail too double reef 3/4 light wind some cloudy
 at 8 PM wore ship heading SE moderate calm Lat 32.43 Long 49.41

WEDNESDAY 31st comes in light wind
 from NE at 2 PM tacked steered by the wind NW saw porpoises
 at night shortened sail middle squally some lightening
 wind shifted to SE noon steered SW latter East saw
 two sail strong wind sup - Mer - so ends

 Brighten of NB clean Remains fair standing
 opposite tack the bark in site Lat 32.14 Long 48.35

Saturday 3rd these 24 hours comes in fair weather some
 what thick at times standing opposite tacks at noon
 spoke Bark Helen Snow seen in Co - Lat 32.13 Long 48.5

Sunday 4th comes in light N wind some
 smoky steering by E at sunset wore ship shortened sail
 left the bark: run calm foggy the bark nearby so
 ends this day Lat 32.12 Long 48.10

Monday 5th comes in light E wind steering
 NW saw Grampus, the bark steering W by E run
 light winds from NW several sail in sight
 Lat 32.04 Long 48.06
