comes in pleasant light air from N^W heading by N by E calm at 12 light breeze from S course N cloudy latter steering N by E rainy saw several sail No M^o Obs^d Lat 25.39 Long 39.46

Monday 22

comes in strong wind from S steering N by W middle N under short sail latter steering N by W pleasant saw several sail Lat 23.21 Long 40.48

Tuesday 23 comes in pleasant

steering N by W with light N by E wind several sail on site one bark steering the same latter saw plenty fish boats, spoke none Lat 23.37 Long 42.14

P.M. comes in pleasant steering in N by W by W for the Sugar Loaf & run in paper Rio fort dropped anchor in 10 fathoms water & received visits of three boats, Guardo Mor, Rio de Janeiro night set watches
