middle light airs at 5 PM light breeze from the
course NE so ends today Lat 33.20 Long 45.19

Tuesday 18

comes in pleasant light winds from
SW at 4 PM course ENE by 11 middle and
after light winds from SW course NE saw three
sail standing 1st species of squid Lat 34.20 Long 44.23

Wednesday 19th

comes in pleasant moderate breeze from
W SW course ENE hauled 40 fucate, Boaters
middle and latter pleasant saw two sail
some squid Lat 34.38 Long 42.44

Thursday 20

Pleasant steering E at 5 PM E by N wind
with ported waile boat, middle and
latter wind fresh from N so end

Lat 35.12 Long 40 29

Friday 21

comes in light squalls from N steering by heading
E two sail in sight at 11 PM by 10 PM middle
and latter strong breeze squally from NE steering
by NE saw one sail susp. whales Lat 34.55 Long 38.05

Saturday 22

comes in fresh breeze from NE steering by heading
by Compass SE by E under M 798, middle heading more
southward at 6 AM tacked heading NNE varying breeze
so end this day one man still sick Lat 35.5 Long 36.57

Sunday 23rd

comes in moderate breeze from East steering by N
wind varying at 1 PM tacked heading SE by E latter heading
E by S, saw porpoises so end one man sick Lat 35.44 Long 36.57

Monday 24

comes in pleasant light breeze from the N steering by E
E by N saw two Finbacks one sail middle and latter
steering E by N by saw three sail spoke a French ship, Sumatra
of Bordeaux 78 days from N. Boston, Lat 36.22 Long 35.16
