middle and latter pleasant employed felling riggin
saw Grampies Lat 30.20 Long 46.36

Saturday 18th

light air from NW steering by SW & -
latter bellin breeze employed upon the riggin
Lunar 45.51 Lat 29.50 Long 46.30

Sunday 19th

comes in calm latter light air from & steered
NW by N Lat 30.15 Long 46.41 Lunar 46.58

Monday 20th

pleasant saw a Barque steering E. wind by
course W, middle raining latter NW wind Lat 30.30 Long 47.40

these 24 hours strong breeze from NW steering
by NW employed rather 1/2 N & 1/2 E, middle squally

comes in strong NW wind with squalls of rain steering
by SW, middle and latter light N wind, fair, con-
by W employed taring & Lat 30.06 Long 49.38

Friday 24th

these 24 hours moderate weather some showers
of rain varying winds NW & finished caltin riggin
and taring saw breaches & so ends this day -
