

Remarks on Board Barge Lexington
Saturday 25th September

commences fresh breezes from WSW steering by NW, some cloudy middle and latter squally wind W heading 1st Lat 31.5 Long 50.8

Sunday 26

comes in fair fresh breezes from W steering by NW employed painting the stern of the ship, middle and latter strong gale from the SW at 10 PM was to the SE heaviest under close of the 1st, Lat 31.40 Long 49.53

Monday 27th

comes in strong gale from WSW bying to SE - barometer 30 vis being 4.6 indicates fair weather middle moderated latter light air N and calm so ends the day Lat 31.55 Long 49.26

Tuesday 28

comes in calm with air from NW night shortened sail, to air NW, remainder light air heading W Lat 30.49

Wednesday 29

Long 50.13

pleasant 3, middle and latter the same wind from NE steering by W employed painting back 8 Lat 31.57 Long 50.56

Cruising for, Piram North Atlantic Ocean 1852
Thursday 30th Oct 25th 52

Comes in pleasant heading NW by the wind saw one sail steering to the NW, latter calm finished painting outside 2 Lat 31.13 Long 51.10

Friday 1st October 1852

Saturday 2nd

Comes in calm at night light air the North shortened sail heading NW remainder light air & calm middle shifted the job Lat 31.15 Long 50.00

Sunday 3rd

light variable air and calm saw night, at 11 PM long from NW was ship NW & steering by NW and sail employed fitting stud and sail gear sent up the booms 3, Painted Devils bears these boat & new filed mast coat & the 2 must 4 & 5

Monday 4th

Lat 30.50

fresh breezes from WSW steering by NW fitting ship middle and last part strong breezes from SW squally at 9 AM tacked down the wind WSW Lat 31.55 Long 52.37
