Thursday 28th

these 24 hours comes in light air from ESE
steering N by E, at 4 PM wind SE light, pleasant
about 60 miles at 7 PM from Mounting light
middle remained light for thirty wind at 3
AM course NE by N sunrise raised the
high lands of East Hampton Dis about 15 miles
at 8 AM N by E 26 fathoms green mud shells
at 9 AM the same cloudy light wind S by E
two sail in sight at 12 AM Mounting light house bore
N by N Dis 8 miles

Friday 29th (Oct.)

comes in light breeze from NW steering N by E
at 4 PM Block Island bore NNE steering SE by E Dis 6
at 8 PM raised up the Light from the Light Boat SE raised
Gayhead light bearing E, Light Boat bearing N by E Dis 6
had lights set and guns fired for Pilot took in
Staten's sails 4 anchors got up sail wind light from
W by W pleasant.

New Bedford for N.B. Oct. 1852.

seen back in 1852 7 file at 10 gayhead light
bore SE by E Dis 2 1/2 steered for the E end of Nantuxet
at 11 PM up to Gayhead Hole wind W by S passed through
steered for Palmer's light N. Westely, shallowest water
in the hole 5 1/2 west side of the Channel varying from
between 9 & 5, at 1/2 past 12 dropped anchor Round-
Hill light bearing W by N 8 Clark's Point light N by W
by Compass depth of water deep 7 mud sucking bottom
wind light from N. S. W. clewed up 1/2 & courses 2
