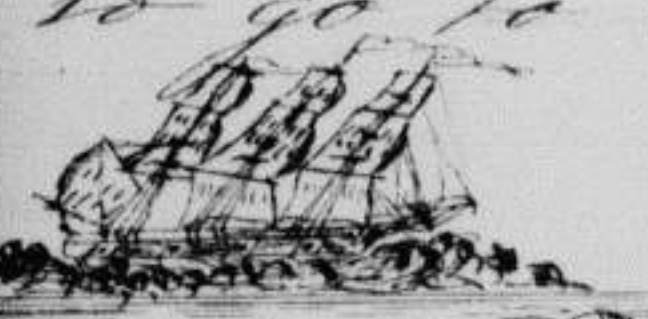


Journal from Providence to the Pacific



Sunday June 27th
 Light and calm all hands employed in
 ships duty two vessels heading to the east
 at 2 pm finished sorting out the blackfish
 middle and later calms at 10 am
 boarded the Humphrey of Baltimore
 J. E. Haller Master in days from Bremen
 bound to Baltimore put letters on board
 to go to America Lat 38 13 Long 63 21



Monday June 28th
 Light from the S. Two sails in
 sight Steering S. by E. Middle
 the same later strong from
 the West one sail in sight so ends
 Lat 39.06 Long 63.33 West



Tuesday June 29th
 Strong from the West saw one humpback
 Steering S. by E. Middle Strong later the
 same the watch employed in ships duty
 Lat 39.12 Long 63.19 West



Wednesday June 30th
 Fresh gale from the West by South Steering
 East and all proper sail all hands employed
 in ships duty Middle more more moderate
 later strong winds nothing in sight so ends
 Lat 39 34 Long 64 09 West

Thursday June July 1st
 Strong winds from West Steering East with all
 sail set at the best advantage sent down the
 fore and stopped in some clothes in the bunt
 and sent it up to the main sent the main up
 fore the fore topmast Middle strong later the same
 Lat 40.54 Long 64.00

Friday June July 2nd
 Strong winds from West the watch employed
 in ships duty at three saw Blackfish to ruged
 to lower the boats Middle more moderate later
 strong winds saw one finback and one sail in
 sight so ends these 24 hours
 Lat 41 19 Long 64 17



Saturday July 3rd
 Strong winds from the S. Steering S. by E. with
 all sail set at the best advantage saw finbacks
 one sail in sight Middle strong later strong
 gale from the S. Nothing in sight
 Lat 41.36 Long 65.40

Sunday July 4th 1841
 Strong gale from the S. Steering to the
 S. by South nothing in sight the watch employed
 in ships duty Middle strong later the
 same moderate
 Lat 41 59 Long 66 29 West
