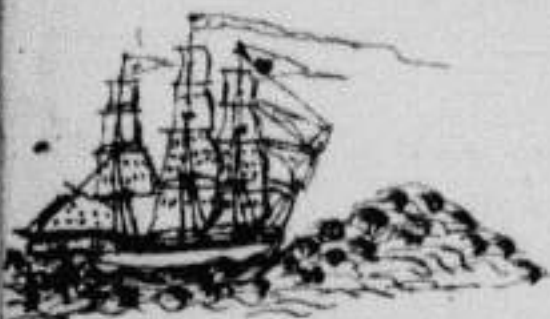


A Journal from Providence to the Pacific



Monday July 5th
 More moderate winds from the West
 one sail in sight steering S by E with all
 sail set at the best advantage Middle
 more more moderate later fine and
 blackfish and finbacks so ends
 Lat. none

Tuesday July 6th
 Fine from the S.W. and blackfish and
 finbacks steering on the wind to
 East with all sail set at the best advan.
 Middle Middle and later the same
 Lat. 41.30 Long 36.34 West

Wednesday July 7th
 Light from the south West steering S by E
 with all sail set at the best advantage all
 hands employed in ship's duty and breaking
 after a case of hands Middle fine later
 the same Lat. 40.40 Long 36.29 West



Thursday July 8th
 Fresh winds from the East steering on the
 wind to the South with all sail set at the best
 advantage all hands employed in ship's
 duty Middle and later fine
 Lat. 39.02 Long 36.34 West

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Friday July 9th
 Fine winds from the East steering on the
 wind to the S.W. with all sail set at
 the best advantage the pack employed
 in ship's duty one sail in sight Middle
 the same Lat. fine and pleasant so ends
 Lat. 41.36 Long 35.40

Saturday July 10th
 Fine from the S.W. the pack employed
 in ship's duty Middle fine and pleas
 later the same at 4 PM saw whales of the
 weather beam at 7 AM lowered and pulled to
 windward at 11 AM struck one whale and killed
 him took him along side and got up the tackle
 and penants and got dined so ends
 Lat. 39.39 North Long none

Sunday July 11th
 Fine from the East all hands employed in
 cutting at 6 PM finished cutting the body of
 the whale and let the head lay along side for
 the night Middle the same later fine
 at 8 PM hooked on the head and hove it
 in one sail in sight so ends
 Lat. 39.05 Long 36.47 West



Monday July 12th
 Fine winds from the South one sail in
 sight all hands employed in ship's duty
 and coiling out the whale Middle and
 later the same Lat. 39.09 Long 36.59 West
