Grandpines Middle and later the same

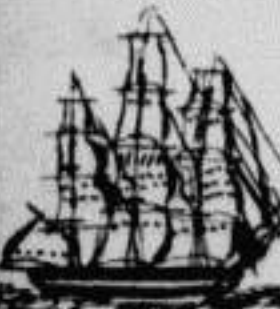
Friday July 28th

the same at 9 AM spoke &c ends

Saturday July 29th
Strong from the East running for the Island
of Flores Middle Strong later the same at 9 AM
spoke the General Pike of Bedfordport left Tokyo
he came on board and fetched me a letter & being
too unwell to go out of the ship the Islands in
sight &c ends then 24 hours

Sunday August 1st
Strong from the East a number of sails in
sight spoke the John & Edwards of Bedfordport
and Robert & Edwards of St. Michael fine later
the same &c ends

Monday August 2nd
Fine from the ESE a number of sails in sight
Middle moderate later the same &c ends
nothing in sight

Tuesday August 3rd
Fresh winds from the ESE nothing in sight Middle
Light tacked ship to the ESE later the same one
sail in sight the watch employed in ships duty
at 10 AM wore to the south

Wednesday August 4th
Light and calm one sail in sight Middle
and later light and calm &c ends

Thursday August 5th
Light from the S.W. steering N.W.
and Grandpines the watch employed in
ships duty Middle light later fine
winds set the lower studding sail &c ends
Lat 35.41 Long 27.45



Friday August 6th
Fine from the N.W. one sail in sight all hands
employed in ships duty and unloading the four
and Grain courses and bending the old ones Middle
fine later the same &c ends

Saturday August 7th
Strong trades from the N.E. and reaches
the watch employed in ships duty Middle
Strong later the same &c ends
Lat 32.17 Long 25.00 W. Coast
