Monday August 11th

Strong from the E. & E. nothing in sight the work employed in ships duty Middle Strong gales Carried away the Main topsail yard Later the same fitting a new yard so ends

Lat 29.47 Long 25.26 West

Tuesday August 12th

Strong trade from East Steering to the South nothing in sight at 2 finished fitting the Main topsail yard and sent it aloft and bent the Main topsail Middle and Later the same so ends

Lat 26.30 Long 25.47

Wednesday August 13th

Strong trade from the East nothing in sight the work employed in mending the shankers and other sundry jobs cleared the decks for the night Middle more Moderate Later the same

Lat 24.03 Long 24.56

Wednesday August 14th

Strong trade from the E. & E. nothing in sight at the lower standing part the work employed in ships duty Middle more Moderate Later fine the work employed in ships duty so ends

Lat 24.14 Long 24.48 West

Thursday August 15th on Board of Ship Lion of Providence with a fair wind Bound to the Pacific

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Thursday August 12th

Wine from the N. & E. Steering before the wind to the S by West the hands employed in sending in the gibson and fitting it and repairing the jib and sundry other jobs Middle and Later fine

Lat 19.18 Long 25.05

Friday August 13th

Strong winds from north Steering S by W all hands employed in ships duty saw Blackbird Middle Light Later much the same Dobs this day



Saturday August 14th

Wine winds from the north Steering S by W with all sail set at the best advantage at 4 PM saw the Islands of Saint Lucia & Nicholas the latter Bonavesta at 7 PM luffed the ship to the East Saint Nicholas bearing S by E the latter bearing S by E Middle Moderate Later Calms the Islands in sight so ends this 24 hours

Lat 16.30 Long 24.12

Sunday August 15th

Light and calms the Islands in sight and one sail all hands employed in ships duty Middle Middle and Later the same Lat 15.29 Long 24.46
