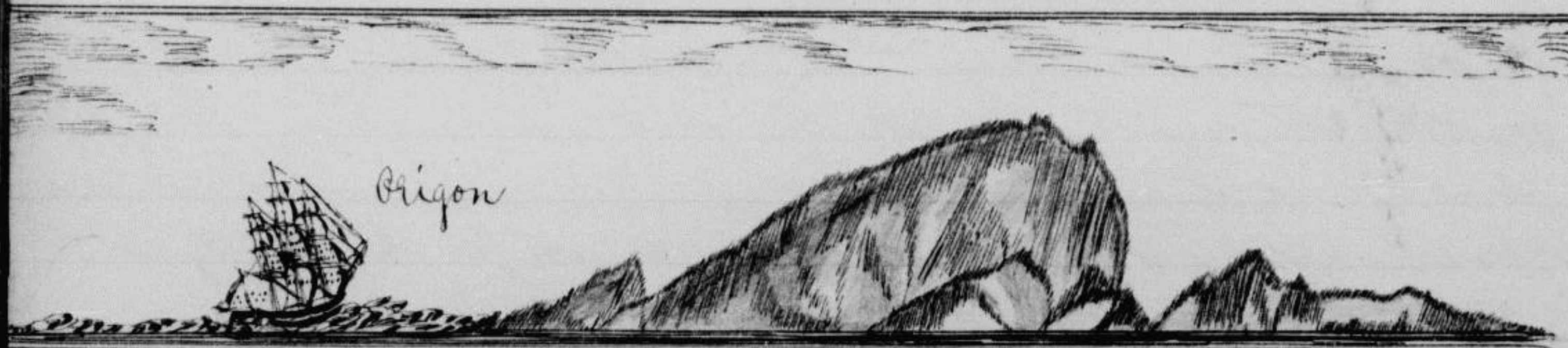


A Voyage from Providence to the Pacific

 winds the Oregon in company at 11 pm spoke the
 vessel of Fair Haven recruiting at
 Bravo later strong 3 sails in sight & on
 No at this day

Tuesday August 16th
 more moderate winds from the North steering
 S by E with all sail set at the best advantage
 The Oregon in company all hands employed
 in setting up the fore and main rigging Middle
 and later light no at this day



Wednesday August 17th
 Light from the South several sails in sight
 all hands employed in setting up the rigging
 and sundry other job Middle strong later the
 same the vessel employed in ship duty
 Lat 20 29 Long 22 58

Thursday August 18th
 Commences with strong winds from the West
 nothing in sight the vessel employed in ship duty
 Middle and later fine
 Lat 20 31 Long 22 57 Dist

Friday August 19th
 Fine from the N by E steering S by E nothing
 in sight the vessel employed in ship duty
 Middle and later equally no at this day

Saturday August 20th
 Equally with rain at 1 pm spoke the Belvedere of
 Baltimore from Boston to New Adria Hanes
 New Holland Middle equal with rain and wind

Sunday August 21st
 Strong winds from the S by E heading from S by E
 to S by E one sail in sight Middle fine later
 the same Lat 20 4 Long Chro 18 37 Loner 18 35 at 1/2 pt 1
 at 4 o'clock Chro 18 24 Loner 18 11



Monday August 22nd
 Fine from the N by E one sail in sight heading to
 the S by E Middle and later fine from the S by E
 worked the fore topsail and set it down to
 repair and bent the spare one Lat 20 5 Long 23 17
