

Ship Lion Cruising on Peru on 1842



Saturday January 1st
View from the SE before the wind
to the north middle and later light

Lat 4° 12' N Long 81° 34' 00"

Sunday January 2nd
Light from the SE clearing clearing sight nothing
in sight middle and later fine Lat 6° 52' N Long 81° 25' 00"
and sperm whales lower

Monday
Saturday January 3rd
View from the SE chasing whales at 3 PM struck
and the iron crosser broke fastened again
and the iron crosser and later the run of the
whale came on board and hoisted up for
the night Middle fine later the same
Lat 8° 42' N Long 81° 15' 00"

Sunday January 4th
View from the SE at 2 PM saw whales lower
fastened and killed the whale at 4 took him
along side and began to cut at 7 1/2 finished cutting
in the body middle fine later the same at 7 1/2
cutting in the head and end Lat 6° 31' N Long 81° 40' 45"

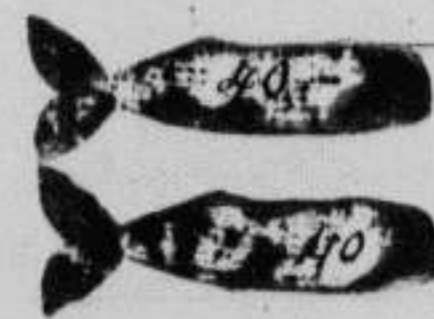


Monday January 5th
View from the SE on the wind to the SE employed
in boiling middle and later light and clouds
Lat 6° 45' N Long 81° 57' 00"

Tuesday January 6th
View and calm middle fine later the same
Lat 6° 45' N Long

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Wednesday January 7th
View from the SE on the wind to the
East at 4 PM saw sperm whales lower
struck two whales and killed two whales
and took them along side for the night
Middle fine later the same at 4 PM hooked
down to the whales at 7 finished cutting in the first whale
and commenced on the second at 7 PM past 10 AM finished
cutting in the second body and hooked on the head of
the whale and took in the head and case the land
in sight so ends



Saturday January 8th
View and calm finished cutting in the head and cleared
the decks for the night Middle a boiling middle and
later light Lat 6° 39' N Long 81° 17' 00"

Sunday January 9th
View from the SE on the wind to the East employed
in boiling middle and later fine Lat 6° 38' N Long 81° 00' 00"

Monday January 10th
View from the SE on the wind to the west employed
in boiling middle foggy weather later the
same Lat 6° 48' N Long 81° 22' 00"

Tuesday January 11th
View from the SE on the wind to the East
Nothing in sight Middle and later light
employed in storing down the oil
