Light and variable from the SE Lying at anchor
at Imbo in company with the Schooner of War the
Elisa Capt. Grace Baltic Capt. Gardner Catherine
Capt. Hunter at 5 pm Capt. Gardner went to sea
Middle fine with strong winds at 8 pm the
Steamboat arrived from Guigila Later fine

Sunday March 6th

Light and variable Middle fine
Lat fine and pleasant

Monday March 7th

Light and pleasant Middle and later
the same

Tuesday March 8th

Fine and pleasant Middle and later
the same

Wednesday March 9th

Fine and pleasant at 7 weighed anchor
and stood out for sea Middle fine
Later the same Lat 5.18 Long 84.40.00

Thursday March 10th

Fine from the SE nothing in sight Middle
and later fine Lat none



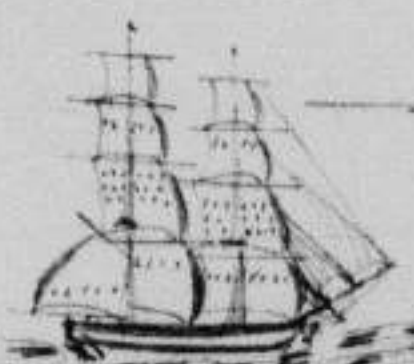
Friday March 11th

Fine from the SE blackfish in sight Middle
fine Later the same Lat 4.02 Long 85.35.15

Ship Lion on the passage to the of shore ground in 1842

Saturday March 12th

Fine from the SE running before the wind to
West one sail in sight Middle fine Later
rain Lat none



Sunday March 13th

Fine with some rain steering west and
Blackfish lower but did not fasten Middle
the same Later fine Lat 3.25 Long 87.07.15

Monday March 14th

Fine and calm nothing in sight Middle and
Later the same Lat 3.29 Long 87.20.45

Tuesday March 15th

Light and calm nothing in sight Middle and
Later fine Lat 3.28 Long 87.42.15

Wednesday March 16th

Fine from the East steering NW by W, and Blackfish
Middle and later fine Lat 2.50 Long 88.42.15

Thursday March 17th

Fine from the ESE steering to the SE by E
nothing in sight Middle and later fine
at 11 am saw the Island of Woods Lat 1.46 Long 89.35
