

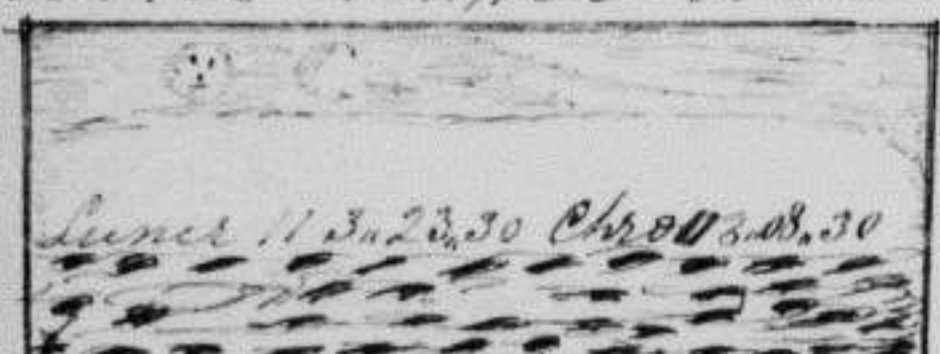
Cruising on the line Jan 1842

Strong Later the same Lat 11° 57' Long 111° 10.15



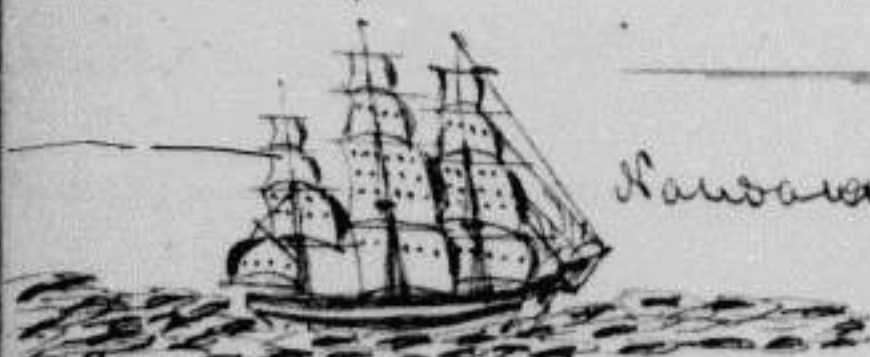
Monday May 2nd

killed them and took them along side
Lat 11° 50 Long 114° 45.00



Wednesday May 4th
Sine from the East took the whales
along side for the night Middle and
Later fine Lat 12° 5 Long None



Thursday May 5th
Sine from the E all hands employed in
cutting in the whales at 6 PM finished
Middle fine Later the same
Lat 11° 22.00 Long 115° 15.00



Friday May 6th
Sine from the East the Transau in sight
employed in boiling Middle Middle
and Later Strong Lat 11° 40 Long None

yard aback Middle and Later fine

Monday May 9th
Sine from the SE steering on the wind to the
South nothing in sight Middle and Later fine
Lat None Long None

Tuesday May 10th
Sine from the SE all hands employed
in slowing oil Middle and Later the
same Lat 10° 01 Long 116° 04.00

Wednesday May 11th
Sine from the SE steering N by E nothing in
sight Middle and Later the same
Lat 10° 08 Long 117° 45.00

Thursday May 12th
Sine from the SE steering N by E nothing in
sight Middle fine Lat the same
Lat 10° 08 Long 118° 00.00
