Saturday July 7th

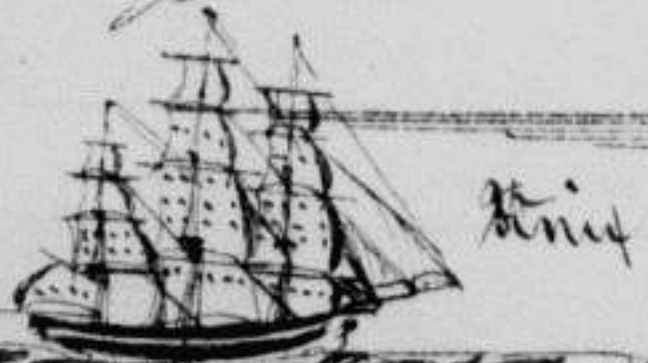
Strong from the SE on the sea to the NE

Sunday July 10th

Strong from the SE employed in storm
Middle and later the same Lat 100° Long 131° 40'

Monday July 11th

Strong from the SE at 8 AM whales lowered
but did not fasten the whals being pulled
by the LC Richmond Middle and later
the same at 6 PM saw Whales lowered but lost
sight of them come on board and hoisted up the
hook at 11 spoke the Henry of Antwerp
Lat 100° Long 131° 55' 15"



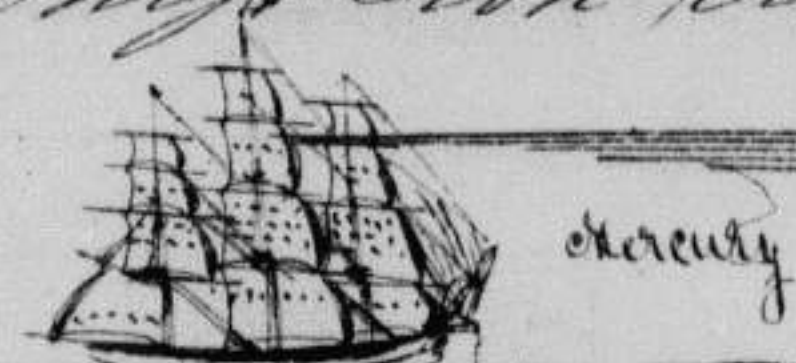
Tuesday July 12th

Strong from SE on the wind to the SE
one sail in sight Middle and later the same
Lat 100° Long 131° 54' 15"

Wednesday July 13th

Strong from the SE on the wind to the SE
in sight Middle and later the same
Lat 102° Long 132° 02' 45"

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Thursday July 14th

Strong from the SE with gusts of wind
and rain at 1 PM spoke the Mercury Capt. Ashel
18000 made and lost the same
Lat 100° Long 132° 12' 45"

Friday July 15th

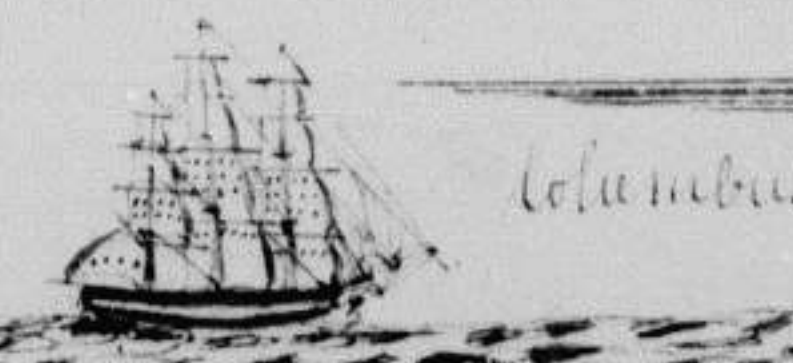
Strong from the SE on the wind to the South
Middle and later the same Lat 100° Long 132° 15'

Saturday July 16th

Strong from the SE on the wind to the SE Middle
and later fine Lat 100° Long 132° 23' 15"

Sunday July 17th

Strong from the SE clearing 10 PM spoke the
Columbus of San Haven Capt. Swasey 20000 spoke
Middle and later the same Lat 100° Long 132° 11' 45"



Monday July 18th

Strong from the SE clearing 10 PM one sail in sight
Middle and later the same at 7 spoke the Henry
of Antwerp Lat 100° Long 132° 49' 15"

Tuesday July 19th

Strong from the SE on the wind to the South nothing in sight
Middle the same later 10 PM
Lat 102° Long 132° 16' 15"
