

Ship Lion Cruising of the Falkland Islands in 1848

Wednesday January 8th
Light from the S.E. Nelson's Island in sight bearing S.W. by S. 10 miles fine later the same Lat 17° 51' Long 176° 13'

Thursday January 9th
Saw from the S.E. Middle Squally later the same the Island in sight Lat 18° 41' Long 176° 13' 30"

Friday January 10th
Light from the S.E. at 8 AM the hauls to the north with squalls of rain and wind Middle squally later fine Lat 18° 45' Long 176° 12' 15"

Saturday January 11th
Light on the wind to the north the Island in sight Middle and later the same Lat 18° 15' Long 176° 00' 00"

Sunday January 12th
Light from the S.E. on the wind to the south the Island in sight Middle and later fine Lat 18° 33' Long 176° 12' 15"



Monday January 13th
Strong with squalls from the S.E. on the wind to the South Middle and later the same Lat 18° 00' Long 176° 31' 15"

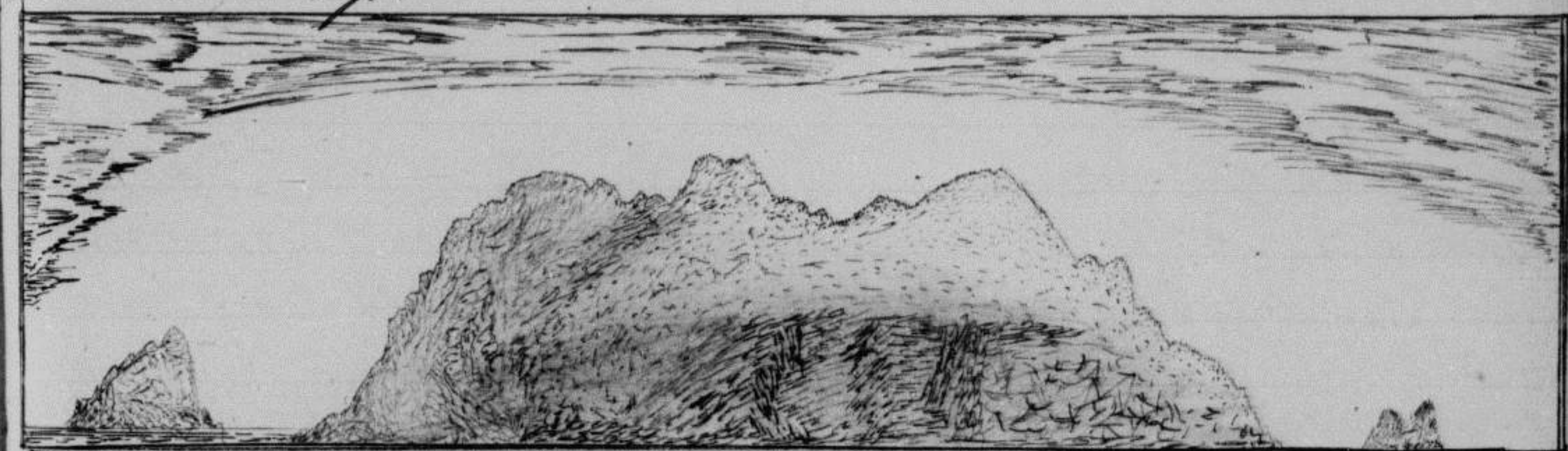

Tuesday January 10th
Strong from the S.E. on the wind to the South Middle and later the same Lat 17° 51' Long 176° 13' 30"

Wednesday January 11th
Strong from the S.E. on the wind to the South nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 18° 45' Long 176° 13' 30"

Thursday January 12th
More moderate from the S.E. on the wind to the S.E. nothing in sight Middle Strong with squalls of rain Lat 18° 45' Long 176° 13' 30"



Friday January 13th
Saw from the S.E. on the wind to the S.E. Obsolete Island in sight Middle and later the same Lat 18° 27' Long 176° 14' 30"

Saturday January 14th
Saw from the S.E. at 8 AM Obsolete Island in sight Middle and later strong Lat 18° 17' Long 176° 24' 30"

Sunday January 15th
Strong from the S.E. at 8 AM nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat none Long none
