

Ship Lion Cruising of the Coast of Am. 1845



Saturday January 28th
Light from the S.W. on the wind to the S.E. one sail
sea sight employed in mending the waist Boat Middle
and later the same Lat 31.35 Long 177.15. 30

Sunday January 29th
Fine from the south steering west nothing in sight Middle
and later strong " Lat 31.25 " Long 177.25. 30

Monday January 30th
Strong gales from the S.E. on the wind to the S.E. in sea pressure
and main top sail Middle and later the same Lat 31.02 Long 177.41

Tuesday January 31st
Strong gales from the E on the wind to the S.E. by nothing in
sight Middle and later more moderate one sail in sight.
Lat 31.45 Long 177.00. 15

Wednesday January 1st
Strong winds from the E.S.E. on the wind to the
S.E. Middle and later the same Lat " Long " none

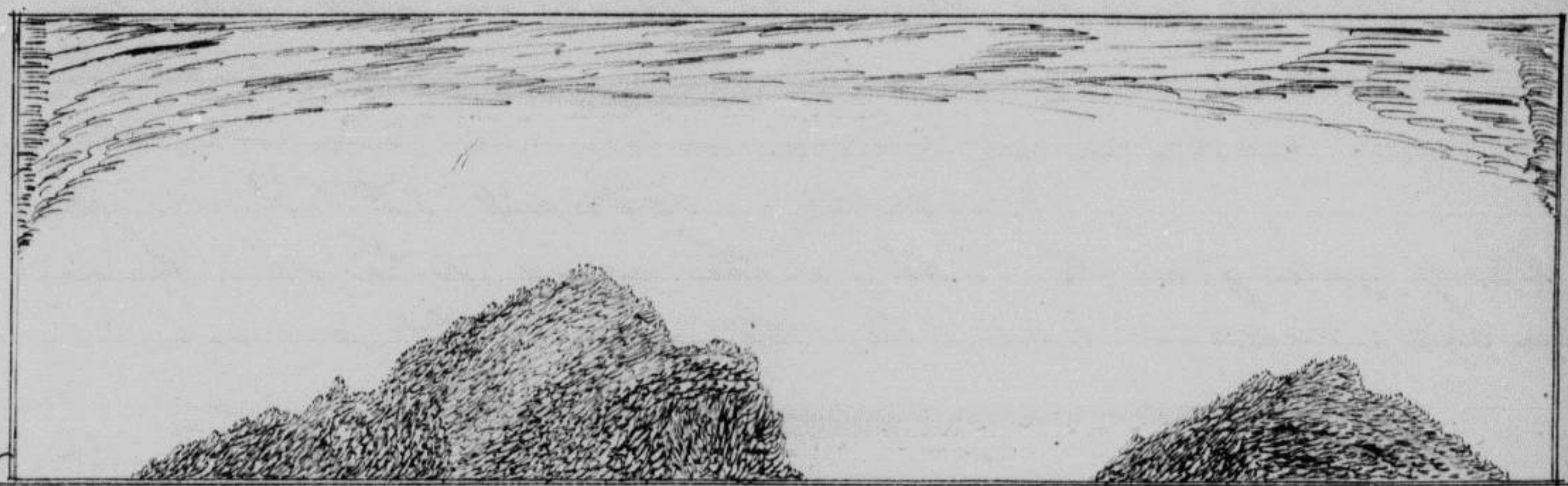
Thursday February 2nd
Strong with rain from the S.W. heading S.E. at 6 PM
the wind heaved to the S.W. Middle and later strong
Lat 31.45 Long 177.45. 30

At 8 P.M. and strong winds to day (S.E.)

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Friday February 3rd
Strong from the south on the wind to the west nothing in
sight Middle and later the same Lat 31.10. Long 177.42. 15

Saturday February 4th
Strong from the south steering S.E. nothing in sight Middle
and later the same the barometer fell Lat 30.42 Long 178.



Sunday February 5th
Strong from the E.S.E. in ring for Naucalegos Island at 5 PM
passed it to the west four miles distant heaved the ship to
the S.E. at 5 PM discovered a rock bearing E.S.E. dist 5 miles
level with the water with a heavy breaker on it. At 7 PM
the Island bore S.E. dist 2 1/2 leagues Middle and later the
strong under blast reefed topsails at 7 PM and sperm whales
lowered fastened and the iron strap parted and lost the whale
Sunday Island in sight Lat 29.52 Long 178.35. 50
