breeze Lat 31.29 Long 178° 19.30

Tuesday April 4th
More moderate from the SE blowing SE by E nothing in
sight middle light later calm Lat 31.25 Long "

Wednesday April 5th
Light from West nothing in sight middle and later
the same Lat 30.37 Long 177° 25.45

Thursday April 6th
Light from the W nothing in sight middle and later
the same Lat 30.21 Long 177° 21.50

Friday April 7th
Fine from the South nothing in sight middle
and later the same Lat 30.35 Long 177° 16

Saturday April 8th
Fine from the South nothing in sight middle the
same Lat strong Lat 30.22 Long 177° 18.50

Sunday April 9th
Fresh gale from the South middle and later the
same Lat 29.45 Long 176° 22.30
