

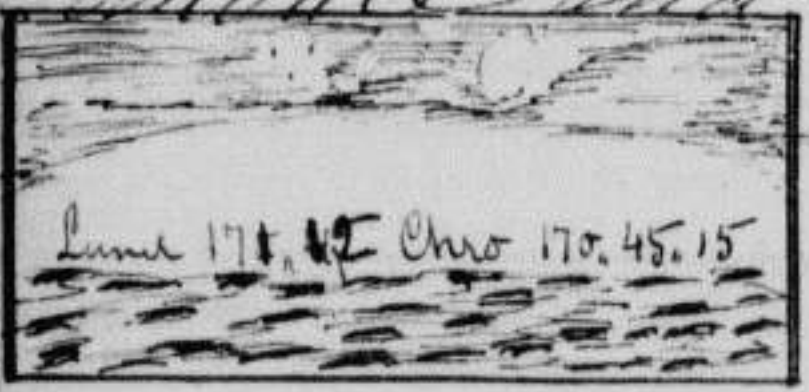
Ship Lion Cruising in the Line on 1843

Sunday July 18th

Light air from the N.E. steering S by E nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 50° 15' Long 170° 45'

Monday July 19th

Light from the S.E. steering S by E nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 50° 50' Long 170° 58.5'



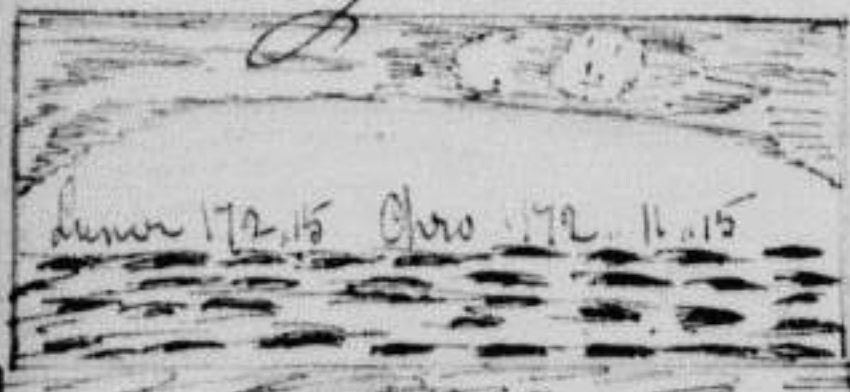
Tuesday July 20th

Wind from the S.E. on the wind to the South Middle and later the same at 7 am saw several whales Lat 51° 40' Long 171° 53'



Wednesday July 21st

Wind from the S.E. went on shore at several places Middle and later the same Lat 52° 10' Long 172° 10'



Thursday July 22nd

Wind from the S.E. steering S by E nothing in sight at 8 pm saw sperm whales lowered fastened to two whales killed them took them along side for the night Middle and later the same at daylight began to cut and finished at 7 am Lat 52° 22' Long 172° 53.5'

Sunday July 21st

Light from the S.E. employed in bagging middle and later the same Lat 52° 10' Long 173° 39' 46"

Monday July 22nd

Light from the S.E. steering S by E Middle and later the same Lat 52° 10' Long 173° 53' 15"

Tuesday July 23rd

Wind from the S.E. steering S by E nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 52° 32' Long 174° 50' 46"

Wednesday July 24th

Wind from the S.E. steering S by E at 5 pm saw sperm whales lowered fastened to the whale took him along side for the night Middle and later the same at 8 pm began to cut 20 minutes of finished Lat 53° 46' Long 175° 16' 30"

Thursday July 25th

Wind from the S.E. steering S by E employed in bagging at 12 past 2 pm saw sperm whales going quick lowered but did not get up to them came on board and hoisted up the boats Middle and later bagging 20 min. at Lat 56° 2' Long 176° 16' 30"

Friday July 26th

Light saw sperm whale lowered but did not fasten Middle and later the same saw whale to midwater did not lower Lat 56° 16' Long 176° 33' 30"
