Tuesday August 22nd

Fine winds from the SE on the wind to the south middle and later the same at 6 am Capt. Kecker lowered his boat and came on board of the Lion of Fair Haven Lat 45° S Long 153° 51' 30"

Wednesday August 23rd

Fine the Island of Hood in sight at 10 am the sailors came off with a few coconuts and had dinner and later the same Lat 1° 54' S Long 155° 28' 30"

Thursday August 24th

Fine from the south steering E by S nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 38° S Long 155° 25'

Friday August 25th

Fine from the SE on the wind to the SE by E nothing in sight Middle and later the same the Island of Hood in sight Lat 1° 14' S Long 152° 59' 45"

Saturday August 26th

Fine from the SE on the wind to the SE by E employed in mending the Perkeara boat nothing in sight Middle and later heavy squalls at 11 am and hope Solana Lat 2° 18' S Long 152° 59' 30"

Sunday August 27th

Fine from the SE on the wind to the south Hope Island in sight Middle and later the same Lat 2° 46' S Long 153° 14'

Monday August 28th

Light from the SE on the wind to the south nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 4° 01' S Long 152° 44' 15"

Tuesday August 29th

Fine from the SE on the wind SE nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 3° 02' S Long 150° 11' 15"



Wednesday August 30th

Light from the south on the wind to the SE nothing in sight Middle and later strong Lat 3° 04' S Long 150° 45' 15"

Thursday August 31st

Fine from the SE on the wind to the SE by E nothing in sight Middle squally Lat fine Lat 4° 06' S Long 150° 15' 15"

Friday August 1st

Fine from the SE on the wind to the SE by E nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 5° 22' S Long 150° 45' 15"

Saturday August 2nd

Fine from the SE steering SE nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 6° 00' S Long 150° 49' 15"

Sunday September 3rd

Fine on the wind to the south Middle and later the same
