

Ship Lion Crossing of the Tropic in 1845

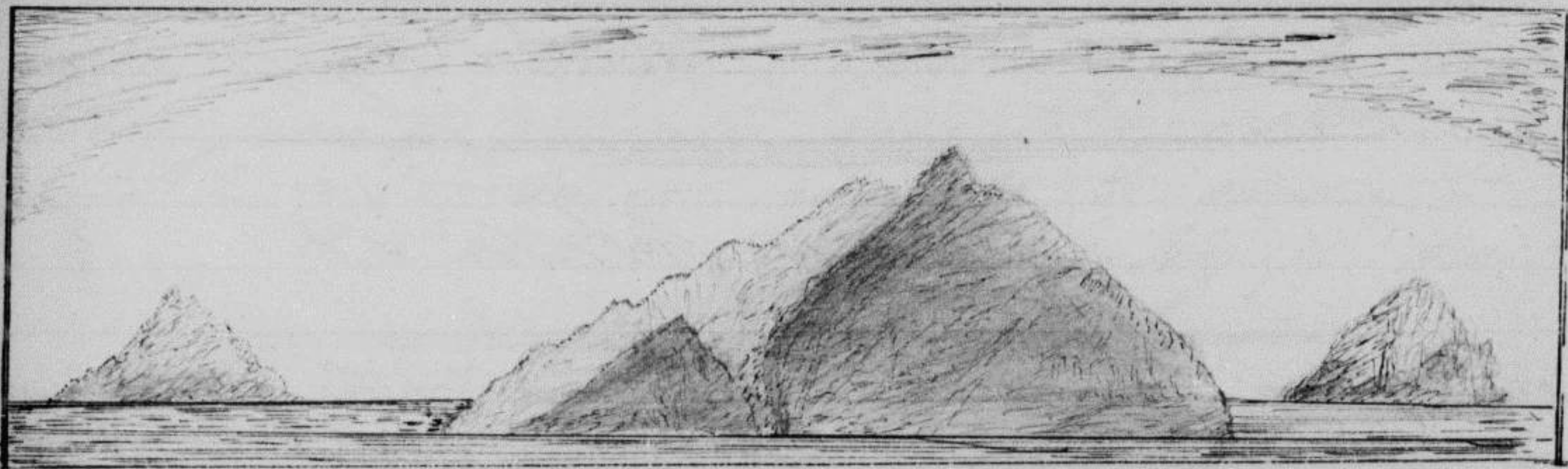
Monday October 9th

Light from the S on the wind to the S.W. nothing in sight Middle and later light

Lat 21. 49 Long 177. 4. 30

Tuesday October 10th

Fine from the S.W. on the wind to the South Middle and later strong with squalls of rain and wind



Wednesday October 11th

Light from E on the wind to the South. Pilot boats in sight Middle and later strong with rain

Lat 22. 25 Long 176. 43. 15

Thursday October 12th

More moderate from the S.W. steering S by E. Pilot boats in sight Middle and later strong

Lat 24. 12 Long 175. 23. 15

Friday October 13th

Strong from the S.W. steering S by E nothing in sight Middle and later strong

Lat 24. 12 Long 175. 23. 30

Ship Lion on Her Passage to the French Rock

Saturday October 14th

Strong from the S.W. steering S by E Middle and later the same one sail in sight at 8 AM saw sperm whales going pick lower did not get up with them

Lat 24. 08 Long 175. 11. 00

Sunday October 15th

Strong from the S.W. on the wind to the S one sail in sight Middle and later the same

Lat 25. 7 Long 175. 02. 30

Monday October 16th

Strong from the S.W. on the wind to the S one sail in sight Middle and later the same

Lat 25. 15 Long 175. 02. 15

Tuesday October 17th

Strong from the South one sail in sight at 9 PM spoke the James Loper of Nantucket 15 Mo 500 Spail

Lat 26. 12 Long 175. 10. 15

Friday October 18th

Strong from the South one sail in sight Middle and later the same

Lat 25. 00 Long 175. 10. 30

Thurs

Saturday October 19th

Light one sail in sight Middle and later the same at 9 AM saw sperm whales lower fastened killed the whale
