Strong from the North at 1 PM finished cutting in the whale Middle equal with rain employed in boobying. Later light Lat 25.55 Long 175.14.50

Saturday October 21st

Fresh wind from the SE clearing light Middle and later the same Lat 25.56 Long 174.44.30

Sunday October 22nd

Fine from the NW on the wind to the SE employed in boobying Middle and later strong Lat 26.58 Long 174.08.15

Monday October 23rd

Fresh gales from the NW on the wind to the SE nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 27.00 Long 175.02.15

Tuesday October 24th

More moderate nothing in sight the wind from the South on the wind to the SE Middle and later calm Lat 27.07 Long 175.38.15

Wednesday October 25th

Light and calm nothing in sight Middle and later strong from the West on the wind to the South Lat 28.07 Long 176.30.50

Strong from the West on the wind to the South at 2 PM the wind heaved to the NW took to the west one sail in sight Middle and later



Friday October 29th

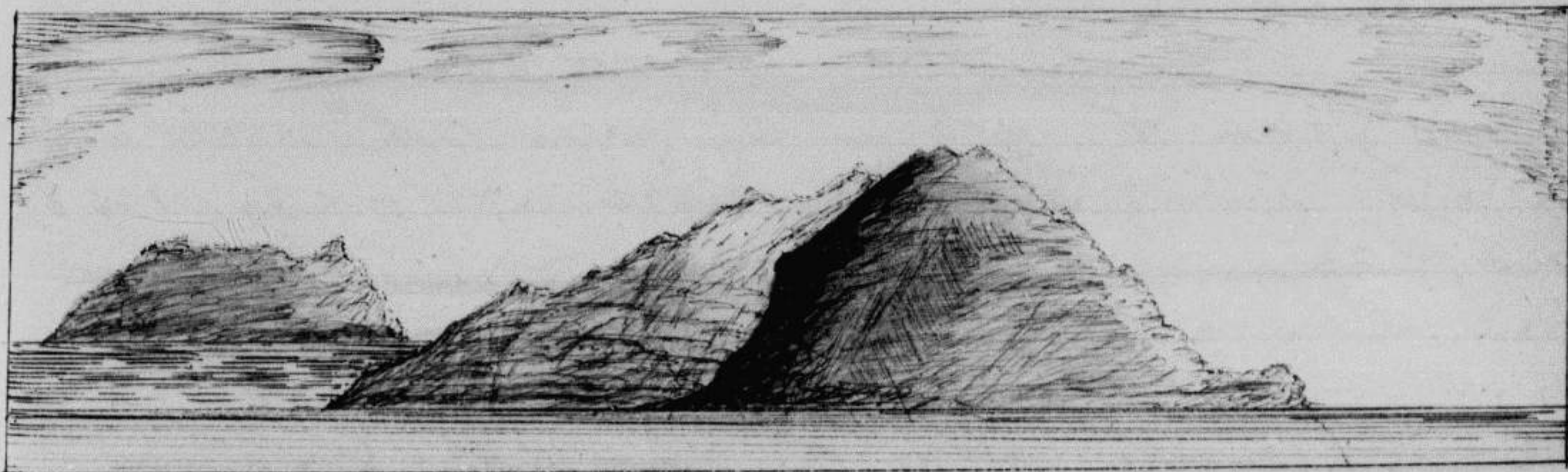
Strong from the SE on the wind to the SE sent a Whaler across Middle and later more moderate Sunday calm in sight Lat 28.55 Long 177.03.15

Saturday October 30th

Strong from the W on the wind to the SE Sunday Island in sight Middle and later the same Lat 29.57 Long 176.32.30

Sunday October 31st

Strong from the W on the wind to the SE nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 30.33 Long 176.58.15



Monday October 3rd

Fine from the W on the wind to the SE nothing in sight Middle and later the same Lat 31.03 Long 177.45
