Light from the South on the wind to the SSW
nothing in sight middle and later the same
Lat 32. 32. Long 191. 30. 15

Saturday Novem 25th

Wind from the S E steering SSW nothing in
sight middle and later strong
Lat 31. 11. Long 191. 34. 30 East

Sunday Novem 26th

Strong from the East Steering SSW nothing in sight
middle and later the same Lat 30. 01. Long 192. 40. 15 East

Monday Novem 27th

Strong from the S E on the wind to the SSW nothing
in sight middle and later the same
Lat 29. 30 Long 192. 2. 15 East

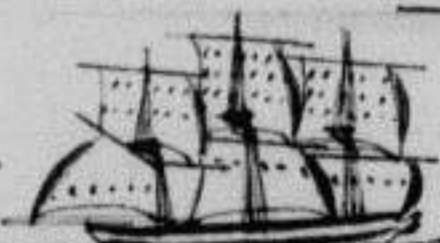
Tuesday Novem 28th

Strong gales from the W S W on the wind south middle
and later the same with squalls of rain
Lat 29. 15 Long 192. 12. 30 East

Wednesday Novem 29th

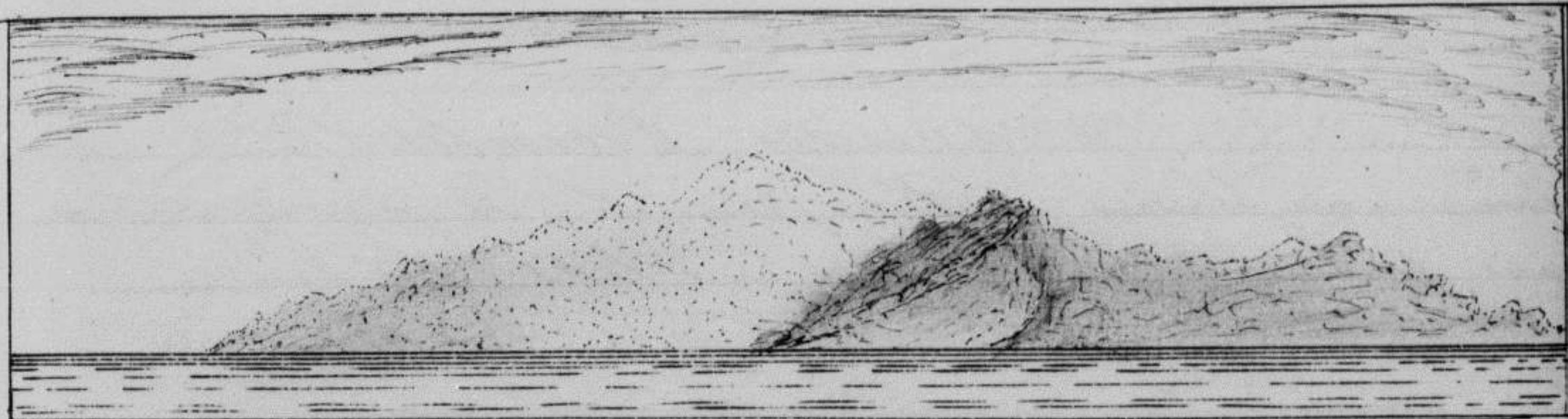
Strong gales from the S E on the wind to the SSW
Wind in sight middle and later fine at 11 am the
boat went on shore after wood & provisions

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Thursday Novem 30th

Wind from the East on shore at 11 the launch came of with
wood the Meria of London Capt James Fretwell 44 men
900 c/s



Friday December 1st

Wind from the S E it being too rugged to land on the south
side of the island bore up and ran round the the North
of the island and sent the ship back in for wood

Saturday Decem 2nd

Wind from the South the boats on shore mending at 3 pm
two boats came of with wood middle fine later
the same at 11 am finished mending the canvas

Sunday December 3rd

Wind from the South on the wind to the East the
ship in sight middle and later the same

Monday December 4th

Wind from the S on the wind to the E one sail
in sight middle and later the same
Lat 28. 36 Long 191. 30. 15 East
