

Remarks on board Ship Daniel Wood. 1852.
December.

Tuesday 21st. At 11 O'clock got under weigh
and went to sea with a strong breeze
from the N.E. stowed the anchors,
unbent the chains and stowed them
below. at 4 P.M. double reefed the top
sails, and chose the watches. at 7 at
the watch.

Wednesday 22nd. Strong breeze and thick from
the N.E. steering S.E.

Thursday 23rd. Strong breeze and thick from
the E. N.E. steering by the wind to the
S.E.

Friday 24th. Strong breeze and rain from the
E. N.E. steering by to the S.E.

Saturday 25th. Strong breeze from the S.W.
course E. by S.

Sunday 26th. Light breeze and pleasant from
the W. course E. S. E.

Monday 27th. Strong breeze with rain from the
S.W. course E. by S.

Tuesday 28th. Light breeze with rain squalls
from the N.E. course S. S. E. employed
in the rigging Lat 34.18 & Lon 46.11 W.

Wednesday 29th. Light breeze from the south
34.08 heading by to the Eastward. employed
46.11 in the rigging
