Time from N.W. course N.N.E.
employed in ships duty. A.M. do. do.
Lat 44.10 N. Long 153.38 E.

Sunday 22

Time from N.W. by to N.N.E. under
all sail. Saw five Barks. A.M. fresh from N.N.E.
by to N. under topsails J. & M. Snow Squalls.
Lat 46.24 N. Long 154.53 E.

Monday 23.

Time from N.W. by to N. Lat 46.53.85
J. & M. fresh double reefed. a Bark and Brig
passed on the W. Tack. Took in Jib.
Lat 46.30 N. Long 156.32 E

Tuesday 24

Fresh from N.W. by to N. under dou-
ble reef & Main. Sail. 1 set the jib took it
in sand bent a new one. 5 saw 3 sails on
weather bow. 6 took in Jib. A.M. moderate
made all sail. 9 raised a Right Whale. Landed
for him. but R. K. 11 came on board. 4 sails in
sight. Lat 49.01 N.

Wednesday 25

Light winds and clear weather from
W. by to (off track) N. 3 spoke the Edgar, Pearson,
4. the Cicero. Manchester. Had a chains Gam.
9. the wind at N.E. kept off N. N. W. A.M. wind
at W. L. N. by to N. N. W. 4 ships in sight. Saw Land.
The Isle of Otokoto and others. Saw a Right Whale
going quick to windward.

Thursday 26.

Time from W. by to N. all sail set.
4 ships and Land in sight. all covered with
Snow. Snow Squalls

Ship Daniel Wood in Onkoton Passage 1853.
Thursday April 26

A.M. Fresh from N.W. Light sails
hauled. working into the passage on cliff tacks.
Land in sight both sides of the passage. 2 sails.

Friday 27

Fresh from N.W. double reefed. working
into the passage. 5 furled the Mainsail. 6 run off
and spoke the Bark Newburyport. Hauled off Newburyport
Light winds. under short sail on cliff tacks.
A.M. calm.

Saturday 28

3 pm took a heave from S.S.E. course
N. N. W. the N. and another sail astern. in sight.
In the OCHOTSK SEA.

A Thick Snow Storm. A.M. wind working around
to E. & chafing off Snow. Took in M. T. E. and double
reefed.

Sunday 29

Fresh from N. N. E. by to N. W. under dou-
ble reef. Jib and Foresail. Snow. Snow. 1 took in Jib.
A.M. moderate made sail. 10 took in M. T. E. & Jib.
sail in sight ahead. picked up a 90 Gall. cask
of Whale Oil.

Lat 52.45 N. Long 149.25 E.

Monday 30.

Brisk from N. E. by to W. under tops-
ail & Mainsail. A.M. made all sail. Berke out
water and made a blubber-room. Wind at S
course N. by W.

Lat 52.50 From F. E. BROWN,
NEW BEDFORD, MASS.

Tuesday May 1

Time from S. Course N. by W.
sent up cutting percelant Blocks. 3 raised a
sail. 6 luffed to the wind and spoke the Bark
Newburyport running all night. A.M. made sail.
the B. in sight.
