Wednesday March 17.

A.M. Fresh breezes at
N^o with squalls and Rain. course E. N. E. S.
daylight, all sail and Sp. Studds
Sat Long 97. 40 W.

Thursday 20

Fresh from N^o with squalls and
Rain. 5 h 2 Reefed fore and Main Spsails.
A.M. Thick rainy weather. daylight made
all sail.

Friday 21

Fresh at N^o, course E. N. E. S. all sail
set. Studds' A.M. squalls wind at S.W. and S.
Sat 54. 45 S Long 85. 11 W

Saturday 22

Fine breezes at S.W. with squalls
5 h. took in J. & Main Sps and Fly jib. A.M.
wind at S^o squally. Wet Cold
Sat 56. 24 S Long 80. 10 W.

Sunday 23.

Fine breezes at S.W. & S.E. course
E. N. E. all sail. Snow squalls. middle light
variable winds from S.E. to S.W. caught a Porpoise.
A.M. light at N.S.W. course E. N. E. all sail. Studds.

Monday 24

Light at N.S.W. course E. N. E. all sail
and Studds' J.M. 2 h. took the wind at S.S.W.
all sail. 5 h. saw 2 sails bound to N^o.
Sat 56. 28 S Long by Chron 76. 00

Tuesday 25.

Fine breezes at S.S.W. course E. by N.
all. 4 h. raised the Diego's to S.E. by E. luffed
to the wind heading E. at 10 h. kept off E. N. E.
A.M. fine breezes at S.W. course S.E. all sail and Studds.
Chronometer lost 5 minutes in 21 days -
Sat 56. 36 S Long 66. 51 W
Cape Horn in sight in the Atlantic Ocean.

Ship D. Wood off Cape Horn. 1856.
Wednesday March 26.

Light breezes at S.W. course
N. E. (24 degrees variation) mending an old
Topmast Stun sail. Bent and set it, and
another Top. G. clo. A.M. fine at S.W. course S.E.
1 Ship in sight working to N^o. Saw Cape St.
Johns. East end of Staten Land. 30 m. dis.
Sat 55. 18 S Long 61. 56 W.

Thursday 27

Fine breezes at S.W. course S. N. E.
all sail and Studds. middle and
A.M. do. do. do.
Sat 53. 05 S Long 58. 56 W

Friday 28

Fine breezes at S.S.W. course S. N. E. for
Compass. 2 h. raised the Ish of Beauchene to S.E.
4 h. passed to S.E. of it 15 m. dis. A.M. 1 h. took
in sail and luffed to the wind. daylight
saw the Land. 9 h. saw the light-house on
Cape Pembroke. 10 h. took a Pilot. and beat up
to Port Stanley. 3 h. came to an anchor.
A.M. daylight took a Raft ashore and filled
it. righted up between decks &c. &c.
Saturday 29.

Tied it up and came on board
Heavy Mail squalls. The Brig Pandora
English Man of War. came in and anchored
Sunday. Lying on our Oars. some to church
and some asleep.

Monday. Took our raft on board. and
stowed it down.

Tuesday. Got 80 Geese, and a small Bull
ok. Ready for sea. ^{Wednesday} Thursday. Blows heavy
from S.W. with Mail squalls. Two Anchors
ahead. Thursday night. moderate
wind at N^o catst and fished larboard
Anchor.
