Fine breeze at S.W. course S.W.
by N. all sail set. 2 sails in sight. one steering
S.W. and one to S.E. A.M. fresh breeze at E.
course S.W. under all sail. Various employment
Ecl. saw a sail steering S. Thick weather.

Saturday 17

Fresh breeze at E. course S.W. by N.
under all sail. Various employment. Thick
foul looking weather. A.M. do. do. 9h. Light sails in
10h. single reefed fore and main topsails.

Lat 34.28 N By Projection. Long 69.50 W
250 m.

Sunday 18

Strong at E.S.E. course S.W. by N.
1h. 2 reefed the main topsail. 3h. the fore
4h. wind at S.E. equally with rain. A.M. do.
8h. calm. Rain. 10h. fine breeze with squalls of rain
at S.W. by to W. all sail set. 11h. took in fore and
main S.S. Rain. Rainy.

Monday 19

Fine breeze at S.W. by to S.W. in the
Gulf Stream. Six at 6h. Water 74. 9h. water at
74. 10h. do at 64. very rugged. a heavy swell at
E. 11h. through. wind at S.W. by to S.W. light
breeze. A.M. Light at E. by to S.W. Painting ship
inside. 3 sails in sight. In Green Water.

Tuesday 20

Light breeze at E. by the wind at S.W.
under all sail. Painted ship outside fore
and aft. middle. Calm. A.M. 8h. took a light
breeze at S. course S.E. by N. saw 2 schooners and
a Brig. Fine Breeze. Bundled the Boat Craft
and stowed it Below. Various employment.

A Thick Fog.

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Wednesday May 21

Fine breeze at S.W. course
S.E. by N. under all sail. Foggy. 3h. clear. passed
3 or 4 small vessels. saw a Black steering to S.E.
sent down our Cutting Pendant. They were
lashed with Lanyard. 12 turned in each
Shackle. A.M. wind at S.W. by to E. 8h. S.E. 3 sails in sight
Home the Jags. Worked overboard. scraped and painted
the Poles 8h. do. do. Various employment

Thursday 22

Fine breeze at W.S.W. by to S.W.
20 odd sail. mostly schooners in sight. some
of them fishing. L.P. saw land ahead. 7h. spoke
the schooner P.C. Weston from Boston to Phila-
delphia. she told us Block Island bore N.
