Remarks on board ship Lion Saturday Sept. 6th
Light wind with a little swell. Sent ashore to seek
more for water. At daylight hove off the water.
The pilot came off and dragged to find the anchor
but did not find it.

Sunday Sept. 7th
Light wind and a little swell. Strains down water. Brought
off an anchor and 60 fathoms chain. got it aboard to
let go. Samuel Buntell a seaman deserted.

Monday Sept. 8th
Light wind at daylight got underway and stood
out. The mate went ashore and brought off
another man to go with us.

Tuesday Sept. 9th
Light wind from N. steering N. lifted a boat from over
head on to the crane. Daniel Harris drew a
knife on the mate while trying to make him go to
duty. he having refused to put him in irons put Sam
Parker in irons for being drunk. The mate being afraid
of his life requested the Capt. to put Harris ashore.
No Ob.

Wednesday Sept. 10th
Moderate wind from N. steering N. The Isles of Pogo
Brave in sight. Let Parker out of irons. At 11 A.M. the Capt.
went ashore at Brave.

Remarks on board ship Lion Thursday Sept. 21st
Hoisting off and on. At 5 PM the Capt. came off Port
Harris in the rigging and gave him 2 dozen
with 2 parts of small rattling line then put him
in the boat with 2 suits of clothes and sent him
ashore. At 5 PM the boat came off bringing a Pr-
ing to go with us.

Friday Sept. 22nd
Bore part squally with rain heading S. Latter part
pleasant. Boarded the English Barque Christina
bound to Falmouth.
Lat. 12.34 Long. 23.40

Saturday Sept. 23rd
Bore part squally with rain from N. heading S. Latter
part light wind and pleasant.
Lat. 11.49 Long. 23.55

Sunday Sept. 24th
Light wind from N. heading S. Sounded for blackfish
but did not get any.
Lat. 11.52 Long. 22.50

Monday Sept. 25th
Light wind and cloudy from N. heading S. Employed
trawling out for water.
Lat. 9.15 Long. 21.57

Tuesday Sept. 26th
Light wind from N. steering S. At 5 PM a heavy squall
with rain. Spoke the Quilt of New Bedford Employed
trawling out for shells.
Lat. 8.55 Long. No Ob.
