Remarks on board Ship Lion Saturday Mar. 16th
 Strong wind from E. heading S.W. Latter part moderate
 made sail. The new crew began his duty having been sick
 since he came on board. Started 3 lbs milk. At 11.
 Tacked ship heading S.W.

Sunday Mar. 17th
 Moderate wind from E. heading S.W. At sunset took in
 the light sail. Latter part squally with rain shortened
 sail down to a close reefed main topsail and spinnaker
 No. 1.

Monday Mar. 18th
 Squally with heavy rain from E. heading S.W. Middle
 part strong gales. At 7 PM took in the spinnaker. Latter
 part heading S. Started a cask of flour. 18 lbs
 No. 1.

Tuesday Mar. 19th
 Strong gales from E. heading S.W. At 2 PM the circling
 of the main topsail parted. furlled it and set the spinnaker
 at daylight sent it down furlled it and set it close
 reefed.

 Moderate gales from E. heading S.W. Latter part more
 moderate.

Thursday Mar. 21st
 Moderate gales from E. heading S.W. At 1 PM was ship
 all the fore sail and mizzen topsail. Latter part fresh
 breeze from SW steering E under all sail.

 Moderate wind from SW steering E by N. Latter part
 wind from E heading S.W. started a cask of bread
 16 lbs.

Lat. 31.18 Long 175.16

Sunday Mar. 20th
 Moderate wind from S. heading E. At 3 PM lowered
 for sperm whales but did not get any missed him.
 At 4 PM spoke the Edward Carr Nantucket.

Lat. 31.25 Long 175.16

Monday Mar. 21st
 Strong wind from E. heading S.W. At sunset shortened sail
 at daylight made it again. Employed breaking out for
 cheese. At 11 tacked ship heading S.W.

Lat. 32.12 Long 175.35

Tuesday Mar. 22nd
 Fresh breeze from E. heading S.W. Latter part light
 wind. At 10 A.M. tacked ship heading S.W. 1 sail in sight.

Lat. 32.22 Long 175.25

Wednesday Mar. 23rd
 Light wind from E. heading S.W. At 11 A.M. lowered for
 blackfish struck one and took him to the ship.

Lat. 32.08 Long 175.16

Thursday Mar. 24th
 Light wind from E. heading S.W. Latter part light wind
 from S. heading N.W. French Hook in sight.
