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Remarks on board ship since Friday, Mar. 23rd

Light wind from N. heading N. W. At 2 PM lashed ship heading S. W. Middle part calm. Latter part fresh breeze from N. steering N. the bark in sight.

Saturday, Mar. 24th

Fresh breeze from N. with rain steering N. by S. bark in sight. At 5 PM shortened sail. At 9 PM were ship heading S. W. by the wind. Run off from 7 to 8 AM and luffed to again.

Sunday, Mar. 25th

Strong gale from N. heading S. W. with rain took in the spinnaker. Latter part wind from E. thick and raining. Set the mizzen topsail and foresail.

Monday, Mar. 26th

Moderate wind from N. heading S. W. At 4 PM were ship heading N. W. Latter part light wind from W. Tossing S. W. made some sail.

Tuesday, Mar. 27th

Light wind from W. with clear weather steering S. Latter part light wind from N. steering S. W. under all sail. French bark in sight.

Wednesday, Mar. 28th

Light wind from S. steering S. At sunset shortened sail. At daylight made it again. At 3 PM spoke the James Arnold of New Bedford. Goat Island in sight.

Lat. 30.00 Long. 178.00

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Remarks on board ship since Thursday, Mar. 26th

Light wind from N. steering S. in Sunday Island. At 9 AM the boat went ashore discharged the Cook John Delany. Landred a spare topmast and lower yard. Raked a cast of bread 30 lbs.

Friday, Mar. 28th

Light wind from N. steering S. spoke the Elizabeth Swift of New Bedford. At sunset stood off. At 8 AM course for sperm whales but got none. Sunday & Goat Islands in sight.

Saturday, Mar. 29th

Fresh breeze from S. working to windward. At sunset shortened sail. At midnight hauled aback on the larboard tack. At day light kept off W. Goat Island in sight. Raked a cast of molasses.

Lat. 30.51 Long. 179.00

Sunday, April 1st

Strong wind from E. steering S. At 2 PM equally with rain. Shortened sail down to close reefed main topsail and spinnaker. At daylight more moderate made some sail. At 11 AM spoke the Louisiana of New Bedford.

Lat. 30.26 Long. 179.29 W.

Monday, April 2nd

Fresh breeze from N. heading S. At 10 AM spoke the Louisiana again.

Lat. 29.40 Long. 179.00

Tuesday, April 3rd

Fresh breeze from E. heading S. spoke the Sea Gull of New Bedford. At daylight were ship heading S. W.
